Proposed Council Direction

- Proceed with negotiations required to implement an Administrative Penalties System;
- 2. Bring forward Council Innovation Fund application to PFC for one-time startup costs;
- 3. Engage key stakeholders on establishing an Administrative Penalties System (APS); and,
- 4. Develop Administrative Penalties Bylaw, and other related and necessary bylaw amendments, and present them at Public Hearing in 2020.
