
Affordable Housing

Provincial Strategy

- Disconnect between current provincial funding commitments and goals of the provincial strategy
- "Affordable" defined as housing that costs less than 30 percent of a household's before tax income
- Strategy not intended to shift responsibility to municipalities
- Meaningful engagement of municipalities essential as strategy is implemented







Alberta Provincial Police Service Proposal

Alberta Municipalities position

- Oppose the APPS models proposed in the PwC
- Urge the Government of Alberta to invest in the resources needed to:
 - Address the root causes of crime (i.e., health, mental health, social and economic supports)
 - Ensure the justice system is adequately resourced to enable timely access to justice for all Albertans.
- Put this question to all Albertans in the form of a clear referendum







Extended Producer Responsibility

ABmunis' Feedback:

- Municipalities must be part of the decisionmaking process
- Current service levels and accessibility must either be maintained or enhanced under EPR programs
- Alberta's EPR programs must accept the same items already included in other Canadian jurisdictions
- AEP should implement paper and packaging products, single-use plastics, and hazardous and special products programs concurrently



Alberta Municipalities Update - May 2022

PURPOSE OF BRIEFING

To update the Intergovernmental Affairs Committee on The City's provincial advocacy and related work with Alberta Municipalities (formerly Alberta Urban Municipalities Association).

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

Summary of April Alberta Municipalities Board and Committee Activity

Councillor Demong and Councillor Wyness attended the April 28 Alberta Municipalities Board meeting; Councillor Demong chaired the April 22 Alberta Municipalities Environment and Sustainability committee meeting; Councillor Wyness attended as Vice-Chair the May 6 Alberta Municipalities Infrastructure committee; and a Member of City Administration observed the April 8 Alberta Municipalities Municipal Governance committee. Issues discussed at these meetings included: the Government of Alberta's proposed Alberta Provincial Police Service (APPS); the Local Government Fiscal Framework (LGFF) allocation formula for communities under 500,000; Alberta Municipalities' Future of Municipal Government project; Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR); and Planning for the Fall 2022 Alberta Municipalities Annual General Meeting (AGM) and Convention, which will be hosted in Calgary from 2022 September 21 to 24.

EPR 101 for Elected Officials Webinar - 2022 May 18 from 12 to 1 PM

Alberta Municipalities and Recycling Council of Alberta (RCA) are hosting an EPR 101 explaining the concept to municipal elected officials. The session is designed for busy elected officials who want to develop their EPR knowledge, ask questions, and learn how EPR programs will change how local governments provide recycling and waste management. The provincial government plans to introduce EPR regulations in June 2022. The webinar will cover:

- Alberta Municipalities' EPR advocacy to date
- What is EPR?
- History of EPR
- EPR programs in Canada
- What does Alberta have? How do Alberta Recycling Management Authority (ARMA) and Beverage Container Management Board (BCMB) fit?
- What are hazardous and special products, packaging and paper products, and singleuse plastics?

Alberta Municipalities has advocated for EPR since local governments endorsed a resolution calling for the provincial government to establish an EPR framework and expand existing recycling programs in 2019. Between 2019 to 2021, Alberta Municipalities worked with our partners, including RCA, to examine the benefit of an EPR packaging and paper program and lobbied the Members of the Legislative Assembly on the benefits of EPR. Prompt Payment Webinar May 18 & May 31

The Prompt Payment and Construction Lien Act regulations come into force in August 2022. These regulations intend to reduce the number of liens filed annually in Alberta. These changes will have significant impacts to municipalities' accounts payable and contract management processes. To better inform members about the changes to contract templates and accounts payable processes, Alberta Municipalities is planning on hosting two webinars on May 18th and May 31 at 1pm. Representatives from Reynolds Mirth Richards & Farmer LLP will provide an overview of the act and regulations, and the impacts to municipalities. Calgary Metropolitan Region Board – April 2022 Land Use and Servicing Committee Update

PURPOSE OF BRIEFING

The purpose of the briefing is to update the Intergovernmental Affairs Committee on the work of the Calgary Metropolitan Region Board Land Use and Servicing Committee (the Committee) from their meeting on 2022 April 07. Councillor Gian-Carlo Carra represented The City at the Committee.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

The Committee participated in a closed session discussion on the Municipal Affairs Minister's proposed amendments to the Growth Plan. The Committee supported a Motion directing the Calgary Metropolitan Region Board (CMRB) Administration to request that the Minister provide a final draft of the policy changes to the Growth Plan and Regional Evaluation Framework (REF) to the CMRB for Board review before signing into law.

In the regular meeting, the Committee received a status update on the priority regional road network improvement projects list for information. The Committee unanimously supported a Motion put forward by Councillor Carra to direct CMRB Administration to complete a high-level review of the project list and show how the list supports the preferred growth areas and policies of the Growth Plan. CMRB Administration is to report back to the Land Use and Servicing Committee no later than Q3 2022.

The Committee elected Rocky View County Councillor Kevin Hanson as Vice Chair of the Land Use and Servicing Committee.
