# Calgary Metropolitan Region Board – 2024 September Governance Committee Meeting Update

## **PURPOSE OF BRIEFING**

The purpose of this briefing is to update the Intergovernmental Affairs Committee on the work of the Calgary Metropolitan Region Board (CMRB) from their Governance Committee (the Committee) meeting held on 2024 September 13.

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

Councillor Richard Pootmans represented The City of Calgary at the meeting.

The Committee recommended to the Board to receive for information the 2024 Q2 Actuals. The actuals summary suggests that the CMRB's costs are tracking closely with budgeted amounts for the year.

The Committee recommended approval to the Board of the proposed 2025 CMRB budget. The proposed budget considered requisitions from member municipalities. Final requisition amounts will be provided prior to the Board consideration.

The Committee recommended to the Board the approval to adjust CMRB's fiscal year-end from December 31 to March 31. The amendment would bring CRMB's year end in line with provincial, federal and Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board year ends. Prior to this adjustment, an audit will be required in 2025 Q1 which will reset the CMRB's financial reporting cycle.

The Committee recommended to the Board that the Policing Subcommittee be dissolved due to its inactive status. The scope and involvement of the CMRB on regional policing will be revisited during the 2024 October 25 CMRB Board Strategic Session.

The Board meeting took place on 2024 September 18 where the above noted recommendations were considered.

## Calgary Metropolitan Region Board - 2024 September Board Meeting Update

#### **PURPOSE OF BRIEFING**

The purpose of this briefing is to update the Integovernmental Affairs Committee on the work of the Calgary Metropolitan Region Board (the Board) from their board meeting held on 2024 September 19.

## **SUPPORTING INFORMATION**

Mayor Jyoti Gondek represented The City of Calgary at the meeting.

In closed session, the Board received a presentation on the Expression of Interest for the Canada Public Transit Fund Metro-Region Agreement Stream. In the regular meeting, the Board approved submitting the Expression of Interest to the Government of Alberta for application to the Housing, Infrastructure and Communities Canada, Canada Public Transit Fund and further directed Calgary Metropolitan Region Board Administration to compile an unprioritized list of regional candidate projects to send to the Government of Alberta to inform upcoming Treasury Board discussions.

The Board approved the proposed 2025 Budget. The 2025 budget year will be the first time member requisitions will be required, as a requisition was not needed in 2024. The amount of member requisitions will be determined based on the previously approved funding formula of 10 percent flat fee, 45 percent by population and 45 percent by equalized assessment.

The Board approved amendments to the Regional Evaluation Framework Interpretation Guide. The amendments address gaps in the process to establish and expand Hamlet Growth Areas, as well as other minor housekeeping amendments to improve clarity.

The Board approved an adjustment of the fiscal year-end from December 31 to March 31, to align with the federal and provincial governments.

## Trilateral Joint Planning Area 2 Committee - 2024 September Meeting Update

#### **PURPOSE OF BRIEFING**

The purpose of this briefing is to update Intergovernmental Affairs Committee on the work of the Trilateral Joint Planning Area 2 Committee (the Committee) from their meeting held on 2024 September 20.

## **SUPPORTING INFORMATION**

Councillor Gian-Carlo Carra represented The City of Calgary at the meeting. Councillors Sunny Samra and Kevin Hanson were in attendance for Rocky View County, and Councillor Ritesh Narayan was in attendance for the City of Chestermere.

Joint Planning Area 2 consists of three municipalities: Rocky View County, the City of Chestermere and The City of Calgary.

The purpose of the meeting was to share the results of the Gap Analysis work applicable to the Joint Planning Area 2, which is now complete, and present the draft workplan for the Context Study for the Committee's feedback.

The administrative team presented the proposed workplan for the Context Study that included a scope of work, engagement plan and the recommendations from the Gap Analysis. The proposed workplan would see the Context Study completed by the 2025 August Calary Metropolitan Region Board (CMRB) deadline.

The Committee was supportive of the proposed workplan and provided the administrative team with feedback on the visioning exercise that is to be the basis of the Context Study. The administrative team was directed to organize this visioning session which will include identification of the main transportation and transit corridors aimed at regionally tieing development in the area together. The visioning workshop is being planned for 2024 Q4.

A site tour of the Joint Planning Area 2 is also being organized for the Committee for 2024 Q4.

Following feedback, the final draft of the Context Study workplan will be presented to the Committee for endorsement in 2024 November.

City of Chestermere – City of Calgary Intermunicipal Committee – 2024 September Meeting Update

#### **PURPOSE OF BRIEFING**

The purpose of this briefing is to update the Intergovernmental Affairs Committee on the work of the City of Chestermere – City of Calgary Intermunicipal Committee meeting held on 2024 September 20.

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

Councillor Gian-Carlo Carra and Councillor Andre Chabot represented The City of Calgary at the meeting. Mayor Shannon Dean and Councillor Rob Wawrynowski represented the City of Chestermere. This was the first Intermunicipal Committee (Committee) meeting with the newly elected City of Chestermere members. The last Committee meeting was held 2023 October.

The Committee received a presentation with a status update on five current projects being worked on collaboratively among the two municipalities. Those projects were: (1) implementation of the 17 Avenue – Chestermere Boulevard multi-modal corridor; (2) the Range Road 284 Functional Study; (3) the Joint Planning Area 2 Context Study; (4) the Tri-Party Recreation Study and (5) the Canada Public Transit Fund Metro-Region Agreement application.

The Committee shared its respective municipalities' commitments to participating in the Canada Public Transit Funding program and to exploring funding opportunities to advance the development of 17 Avenue – Chestermere Boulevard multi-modal corridor. Implementation of the multi-modal corridor vision was identified as important to both municipalities.

Advancing opportunities for recreation was identified as priority work by Chestermere members. The Committee agreed to hold a follow-up meeting in the immediate future to discuss collaboration on regional recreation initiatives including an update on the Tri-Party Recreation Study that includes Rocky View County.

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

Mayor Jyoti Gondek, Councillor Evan Spencer and Councillor Kourtney Penner represented The City of Calgary (City) at the meeting. Reeve Crystal Kissel, Councillor Sunny Samra and Councillor Al Schule represented Rocky View County (County).

The primary agenda items included the next steps in the approval process for the statutory plan and statutory plan amendments, an infrastructure update, a government relations update and an overview of the Prairie Economic Gateway Deal Agreement (Agreement). City and County Administrations provided information on the preliminary Agreement outline, principles and key Agreement items, receiving direction from the Committee to incorporate into the Agreement. Finally, the Committee discussed the appropriate timing to transition governance for Prairie Economic Gateway from the Elected Steering Committee to an Oversight Committee.

The next meeting of the Elected Steering Committee is scheduled for 2024 November 15.

Federation of Canadian Municipalities Annual Conference and Trade Show June 2024 - Update

## **PURPOSE OF BRIEFING**

To update the Intergovernmental Affairs Committee on The City of Calgary's role as host of the Federation of Canadian Municipalities' Annual Conference and Trade Show.

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

The City of Calgary hosted the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) Annual Conference and Trade Show from 2024 June 6 to 9. The conference is the largest gathering of municipal elected officials in Canada.

This year's conference was the largest that FCM has ever held with 3,346 registrants:

- 1,903 delegates (1,501 of these were elected officials)
- 280 companions
- 637 exhibitors
- 84 speakers
- 125 sponsors
- 271 staff, suppliers, volunteers (includes City conference support staff and FCM staff)
- 46 miscellaneous (for example, media)

This number does not include study tour providers, comprising additional City staff, Civic Partners and other community entities who devoted their time and efforts to planning and hosting tours showcasing their programs and facilities.

The conference's start on June 6 coincided with the early morning watermain breakage Alberta Emergency Alert. The emergency's impact on the conference itself was minimal with only five study tours cancelled - four tours of the Emergency Operations Centre and one of the Glenmore Water Treatment Centre. The City and FCM worked to ensure conference delegates were aware of the issue and the need to conserve water use where possible.

The conference required support from across the Corporation and into the larger community. Staff across five departments hosted 26 unique study tours with an additional 13 tours provided by Civic Partners, community entities and FCM partners. In all 49 tours were run. Nearly 90 City staff provided on-site support throughout to ensure smooth conference operations. Calgary Transit was a key partner by providing all transportation for study tours and free transit access for delegates during the conference. Support from Tourism Calgary included promotions at the 2023 Toronto FCM conference, hosting FCM site visits, providing on-site tourism information and volunteers to assist with wayfinding.

Behind the scenes, numerous staff from areas as varied as Events, Supply, Finance, Human Resources, Emergency Management, Occupational Health and Safety, Accounts Payable provided advice, support and assistance with the many administrative functions needed to plan, execute and close off the conference.

Post conference, Tourism Calgary calculated an economic impact of \$8.27 million to Calgary, surpassing the 2023 estimate of \$7.7 million. Additionally, the estimated number of hotel nights came in at 102 per cent of pre-conference projections.

Despite substantial inflation since the conference was awarded to The City in 2020 January, the end cost to The City was significantly below budget, through a combination of careful initial budgeting, and higher-than-expected registration revenues and sponsorship opportunities provided to The City by FCM. The total City expenditure was approximately \$1.05 million, which was offset by \$700,000 in revenue, for a final net cost to The City of just under \$350,000.

Overall, the conference was a tremendous success for both FCM and The City. With the conference's growth, a limited number of venues for this conference of this size, and The City's success as host, The City will be a logical host in the future.
