1. New FCM Policy Direction

At their September 2019 meeting, the FCM Board of Directors adopted the following policy direction:

- A resolution calling on the federal government to increase access to a safe supply of prescription drugs to treat substance use disorder
- A City of Calgary resolution calling on the federal government to consider and ameliorate negative regional impacts of the federal mortgage "stress test"
- Changes to FCM policy on telecommunications rights-of-way to call on
 Ottawa to uphold municipalities' role managing public space for public benefit
- A resolution calling on the federal government to support municipalities in their management of "tent cities" or similar encampments
- A call on the federal government to require medical cannabis producers to ensure compliance with municipal bylaws prior to application

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2. FCM Election Strategy



Non-partisan platform asks all federal parties to:

- Renew core infrastructure through a permanent doubling of the Gas Tax Fund transfer.
- Build tomorrow's public transit by launching a permanent, direct federal funding mechanism.
- Tackle housing affordability by engaging with municipalities to address the gap between rents, house prices and income levels.
- Protect Canadians from natural disasters and climate change by investing in local adaptation projects.

Municipalities are building better roads, bridges and public transit. We're building communities with clean water, decent housing and rich recreational opportunities. We're building solutions to complex challenges, from housing affordability to new weather extremes.

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
