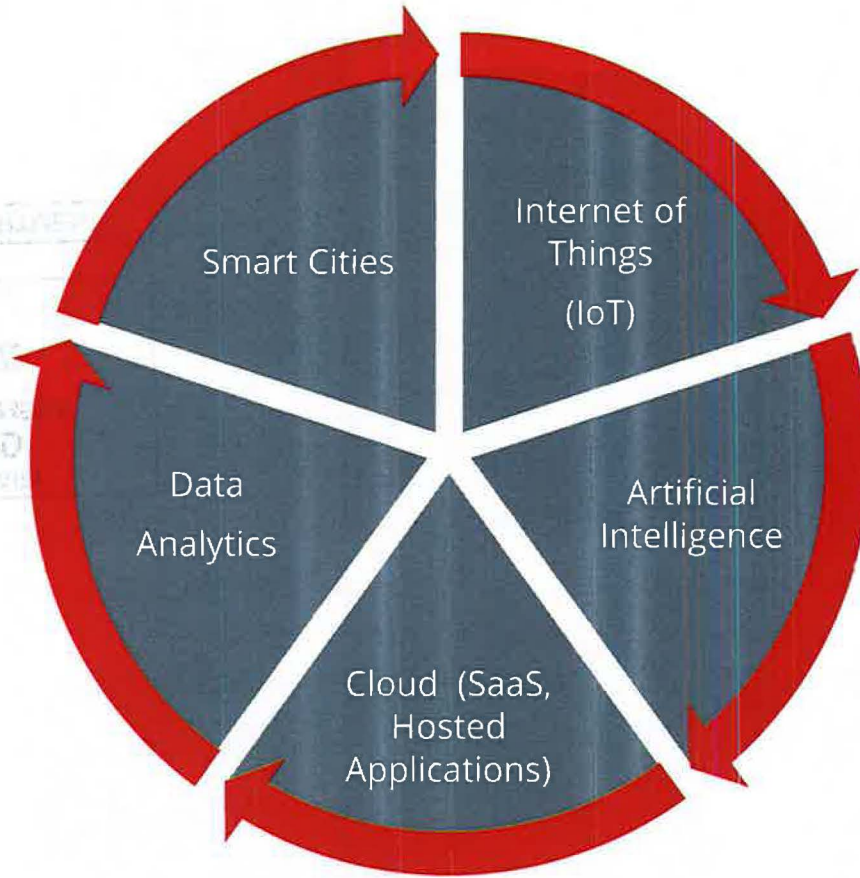
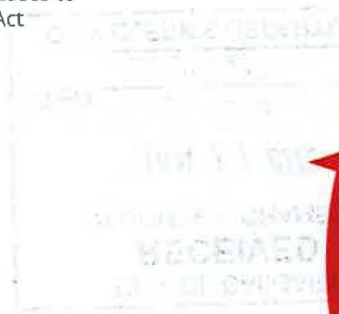

# Legislation and Technological Innovation

- 1995** Alberta Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act comes into force
- 1998** Calgary appoints City Clerk FOIP Head and creates program and processes to comply with FOIP Act
- 2007** Privacy Impact Assessment Administrative Policy approved
- 2019** City of Calgary Citizen Privacy Data Practices NoM Launch of Online Privacy Awareness Training
- 2020** Development of Privacy Charter, Privacy Principles





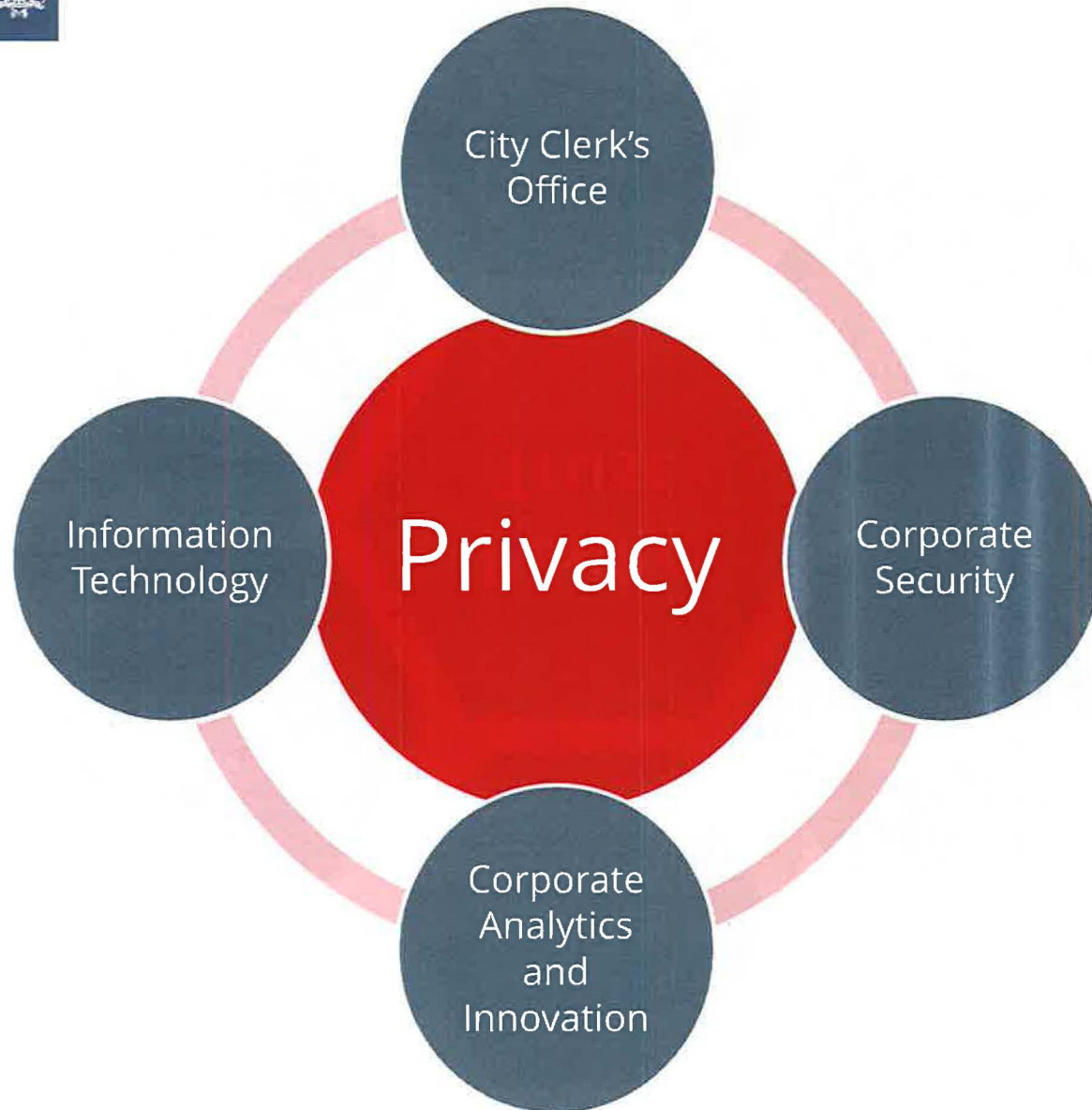

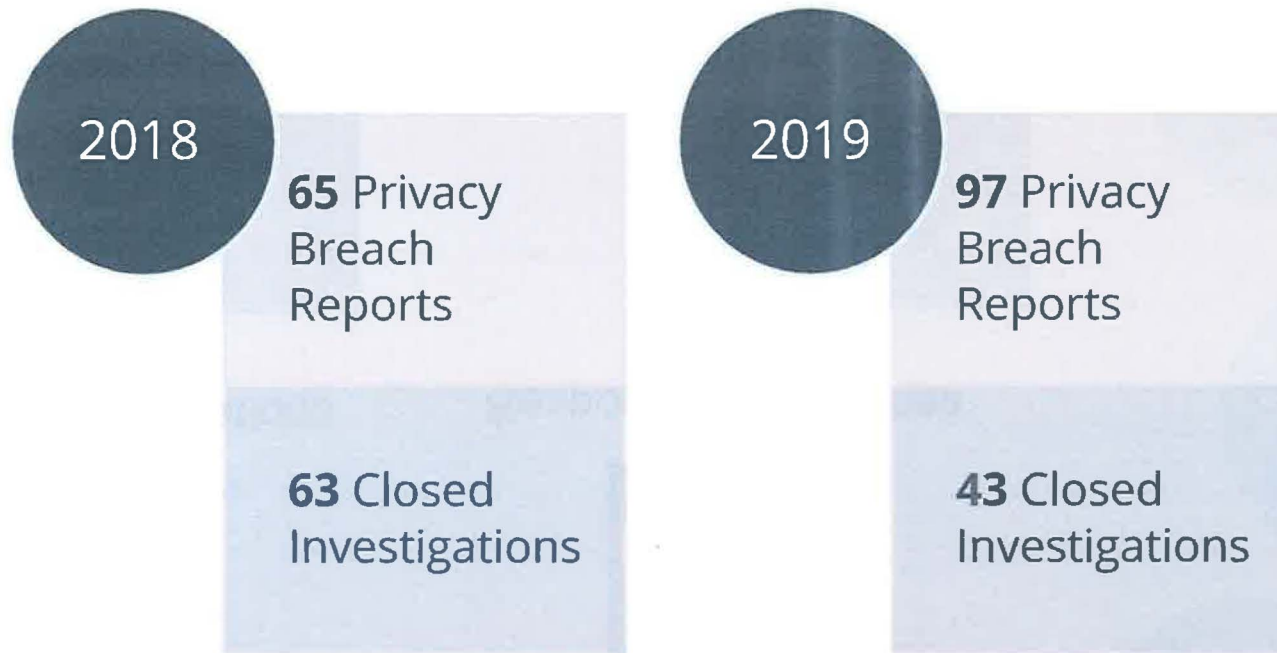

“Data belongs to citizens. If The City collects data it will go in the Public Catalogue. Data is only closed to protect privacy and to provide security. Information will be shared in a manner such that it will not impact the privacy of individuals. **Privacy and security are not an afterthought; they are part of the design.**”

“We recognize that open data can only be unlocked when citizens are confident that **open data will not compromise their right to privacy.**”

## **Asset and operational data**

## **Accountability data**

A potential growth area focused on government transparency

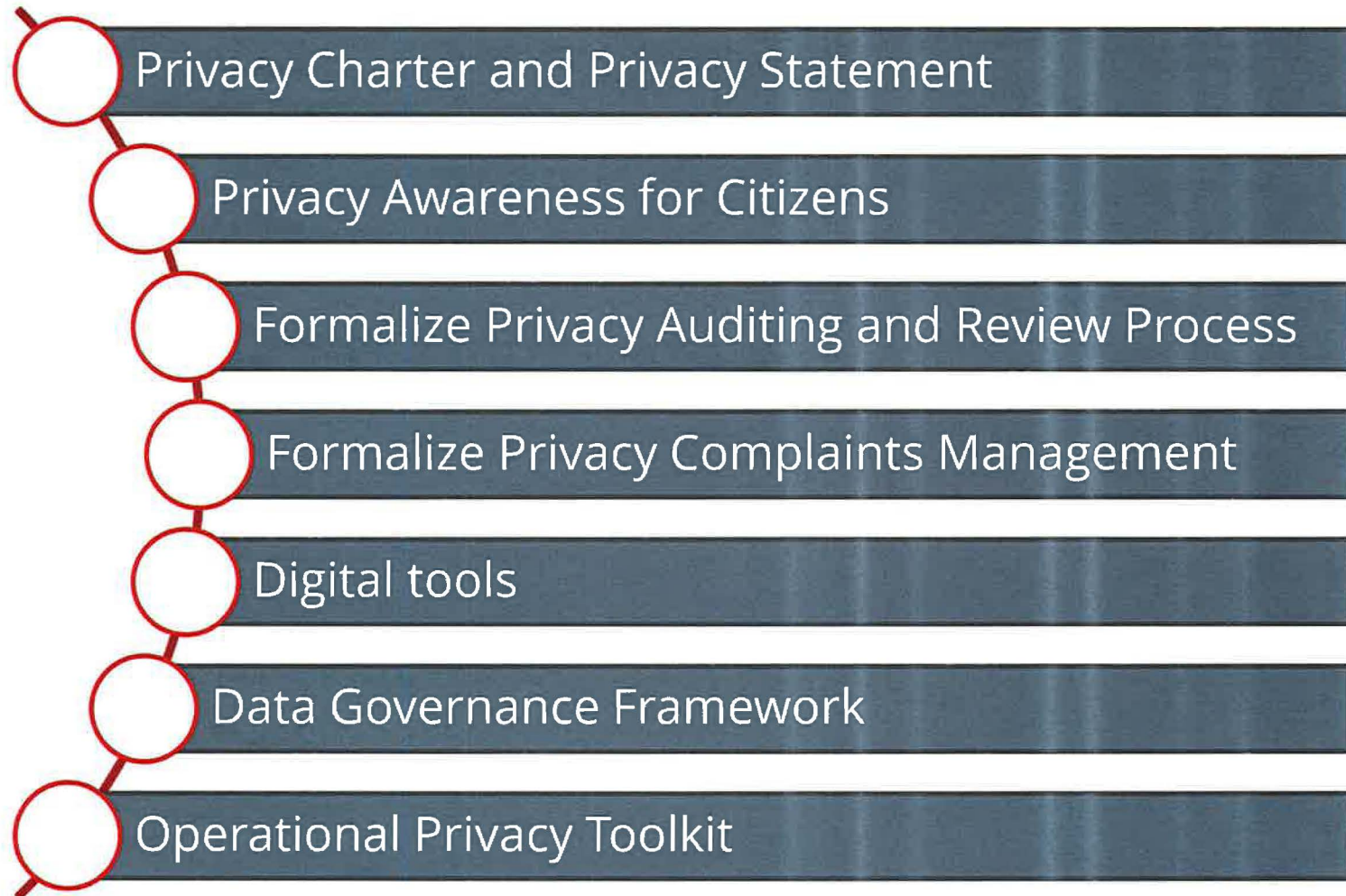
*e.g. compensation disclosure, elections, spending, council voting*

## **Smart City data**

Smart City technologies increase the volume, variety and velocity of data being collected, and make it even more important to consider privacy, security and openness from the start.
