I am writing on behalf of the Bridgeland - Riverside Community Association Heritage committee in general support of the proposals. I regret that I have not been able to give the report the attention it deserves given the emergency of the Covid19 pandemic. However the heritage of community's such as ours -which have been in existence for 113 years (Bridgeland) and 110 years (Riverside) - must be valued and strong policies must be in place. As one of Calgary's original working class communities, Bridgeland -Riverside is not full of classic large edifices from a single era ... rather its heritage is seen in it's modest architecture and features such as front porches with seating, small open style fenced yards, modest size windows, sloped rooflines and fruit trees in the yards and its friendly and accessible treed streetscapes. Clusters of well maintained modest heritage homes still exist on our streets but financial incentives are needed in the policy to support retention of these homes.
