#### BYLAW 34M2017 <u>Proposed Text for a Bylaw to Amend Bylaw 23M2006, The</u> <u>Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw</u>

Three Readings

Background: Administration has identified that amendments to the Responsible Pet Ownership (RPO) Bylaw 23M2006 are needed to enable the City to graze livestock on City lands. The RPO bylaw must be amended as it currently regulates livestock and activities associated with targeted grazing. The proposed amendment would exempt The City from the regulations in the RPO in respect to the use of animals used for land management and weed control on City-owned lands. This report complements Land Use Bylaw amendments, to be heard at the same Council meeting, that will allow this activity to be exempt from a development permit when conducted by or on behalf of the City on City-owned lands.

Prior Direction: On 2016 November 7, Council voted to ADOPT, Moved by Councillor Woolley, Seconded by Magliocca, the SPC on Community and Protective Services Recommendation 4 contained in Report CPS2016-0825 be adopted, as follows:

"Direct Administration to investigate the necessary bylaw amendments to allow The City to use livestock grazing as a land management and weed control tool on City of Calgary lands in 2017".

On 2017 June 01, Calgary Planning Commission received M2017-018 "Targeted Grazing", which includes an amendment to Land Use Bylaw 1P2007 to allow for targeted grazing on City-Owned Lands. This report is also included on the agenda for the 2017 July 31 Combined Meeting of Council.
