It also includes land purchase for interchange area. The construction will provide direct access to the airport from Airport Trail and will facilitate free-flow goods movement from Deerfoot Trail to Stoney Trail. Additional scope such as the widening of Airport Trail between 60 ST and Stoney Trail, and connecting east across Stoney Trail, may be considered in developing the EOI. | | | | |
| | | Airport Trail is classified as a skeletal road and serves as a key east west link in northeast Calgary. With the opening of the airport tunnel in 2014, the completion of Airport Trail as a continuous connection from Stoney Trail to Deerfoot Trail becomes increasingly important. This project supports the ongoing development of the entire NE area including Savannah, Cityscape and Cornerstone. This project is consistent with and supports growth management. The Calgary Airport Authority will provide contribution of \$37.5M towards the project. The Federal Government contribution could be up to 50% of the project cost if successful. | | | | |
