


Downtown Flood Barrier and Eau Claire Promenade:


The Downtown Flood Barrier and Eau Claire Public Realm project will make significant improvements to the experience of Eau Claire and the Bow River as well as the sustainability and resiliency of the city at large. Improvements include:


- 830 lineal metres of new dedicated bike paths;
- 830 lineal metres of new pedestrian promenade;
- 130 new trees;
- 50 new light poles (including bollards);
- 1400 lineal metres of new floodwall protecting downtown, and;
- 130 lineal metres of accessible lagoon edge + increased accessibility throughout.



















Lagoon and Dock (Facing Jaipur Bridge)
