Number of meetings in the last year.	The Board holds its Organizational Procedural Meeting annually, prior to its first regular meeting of the year, to discuss procedural matters and appoint its Chair and Vice-Chair for the year.
	In 2019, the Board met three times in addition to its Organizational Procedural Meeting. Seven appeals where filed: one against the revocation of a Business Licence and six against Remedial Orders. Four of these appeals were withdrawn prior to the scheduled hearing date, two appeals were varied by the LCSAB (Remedial Orders), and one appeal was allowed (Remedial Order).

Summary of initiatives, projects or work completed or ongoing in the last year.	The Board focused on carrying out its mandate by hearing appeals that were filed under the LCSAB Bylaw.
Outline of 2020 work plan.	The LCSAB will continue to educate and inform the public on how to participate in the appeal process and be adequately prepared to participate in the process by improving all communication mediums.
	As part of a larger review by the City Clerk's Office to review all tribunal websites, the LCSAB website will be reviewed to ensure that it is modernized and current, and serves its purpose of providing the public with the information they need to be able to present their cases to the LCSAB.
Challenges to fulfilling mandate.	The LCSAB mandate is to hear appeals of a number of matters decided by The City of Calgary Administration, as set out in the LCSAB Bylaw. In recent years, the number of appeal hearings before the LCSAB has declined, in 2018 only one appeal was filed.
