And further, it be resolved that Administration report back directly at the Public Hearing of Council on 2017 June 12.



Study Area Overview

Publically accessible facilities currently utilized for recreation, arts and culture activities:

- Six Community Associations
- Genesis Centre
- Village Square Leisure Centre
- Public Libraries
- Hangar Flight Museum
- Rotary Challenger Park
- Programmable outdoor spaces such as Prairie Winds Park





Investigation

Optimized Recreation Facilities

- Approximately 156,000 square feet
- Serve a Population of approximately 75,000 to 80,000
- Provide two square feet of aquatic and recreation space per person

Arts Centres

- Treated as regional amenities
- Considered on their own merit
- Co-located where possible








Future Needs Assessment

<u>2028</u>


Projected population in overall catchment will increase by 53,000





North East Community 'A' Area Structure Plan

- Optimized Recreation Facility of approximately 156,000 ft²
- Service a catchment population of 75,000 to 80,000
- Co-location opportunities with Arts and Culture and Calgary Public Library





Overall Findings

- 1) Recreation service coverage within Wards 3 and 5 east of Deerfoot Trail is currently sufficient
- 2) Arts and Culture service coverage gap has been identified within Ward 3, east of Deerfoot Trail
- 3) Citywide there are higher priority service gaps in both Arts & Culture and Recreation that need to be addressed prior to any further investment in Wards 3 and 5
- 4) A future service gap, due to population growth, has been identified within Wards 3 and 5. In response, planning is underway for future optimized recreation and culture facilities
