My Ward 1 Councillor has informed me that the City of Calgary is seeking financial "Backstopping" from the Federal Government in order to assure it has sufficient financial assistance to pay employees and provide for continuing city services. A multibillion dollar project at this time is simply unaffordable and unnecessary. 2. It will not be affordable in the future. The project will assuredly cost 30-50% more than budgeted and Calgary citizens will have to pick up the tab. As has been pointed out by others (ie. Jim Grey) substantial cost over-runs on this project have a very high probability of occurring. 3. It is unnecessary. The work world has changed completely as a result of Covid-19. There will be far fewer individuals needing public transit going forward, especially those communing to the downtown core which already has a building vacancy rate of approximately 35%.

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Proposed Green Line revision to alinement

A proposed alinement for the Green line that I would like to show is to save money to the city.

Some areas will still be underground for the north sections. But I would like to show it is possible to reuse existing infrastructure to run a new green line from the south to the north. The following is a step by step description of how this can be achieved. Please use the images sent to as you read through the document.

- 1. South leg of the green line can be attached underground at the new library to make it so the green line runs down 7th Ave (see image 1)
- 2. Green line runs thru down town on 7th to save cost of tracks need on 2nd St.
- 3. Green Line then Turns Out of down town to the NW line. This will then reuse the existing bridge over the river there by saving more money. (See Image 2)
- 4. The line will then split from the NW line and go up 10th Street beside SAIT. (See Image 3)
- 5. The green line will then run up 10th to Confederation Park
- 6. Once at Confederation Park the line can run beside park or under the park in a trench like the SE leg has. To save the park as a park. (See Image 4)
- 7. This then will bring the line to the Cemetery and the Bike Path. Run the Green line thru there. This then will go past James Fowler High School. (See Image 5)
- 8. After that it is open unused field around and past homes.
- 9. I would either go under or over Centre Street and McKnight Blvd to save traffic tie ups.
- 10. In (Image 6) I suggest a way to tie back into Centre Street to continue into the rest of the design you have already going to the North Zone.

With This suggestion you save construction in the Down Town area and save the construction of another Bridge over the Bow River. It may cost elsewhere on the line but it might get it farther north than what you had in your first Phase for the green line.
