



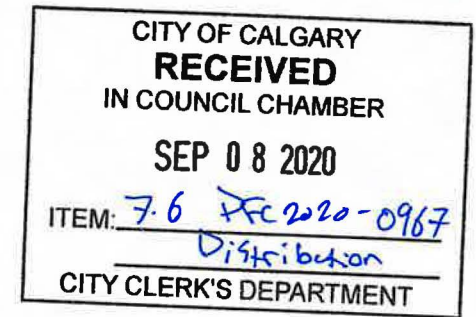

Same experience for all Members (in-person or remote)

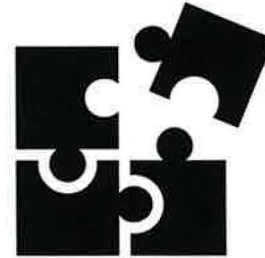

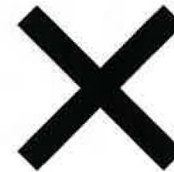

## E-Voting Framework



Where an e-vote result shows that three or more Members indicate their opposition to a motion, a Roll-Call vote must be taken. [Procedure Bylaw s. 119(4)]



- General Consent
- Bylaws:
  - Voice vote for first, second, and authorization for third reading
