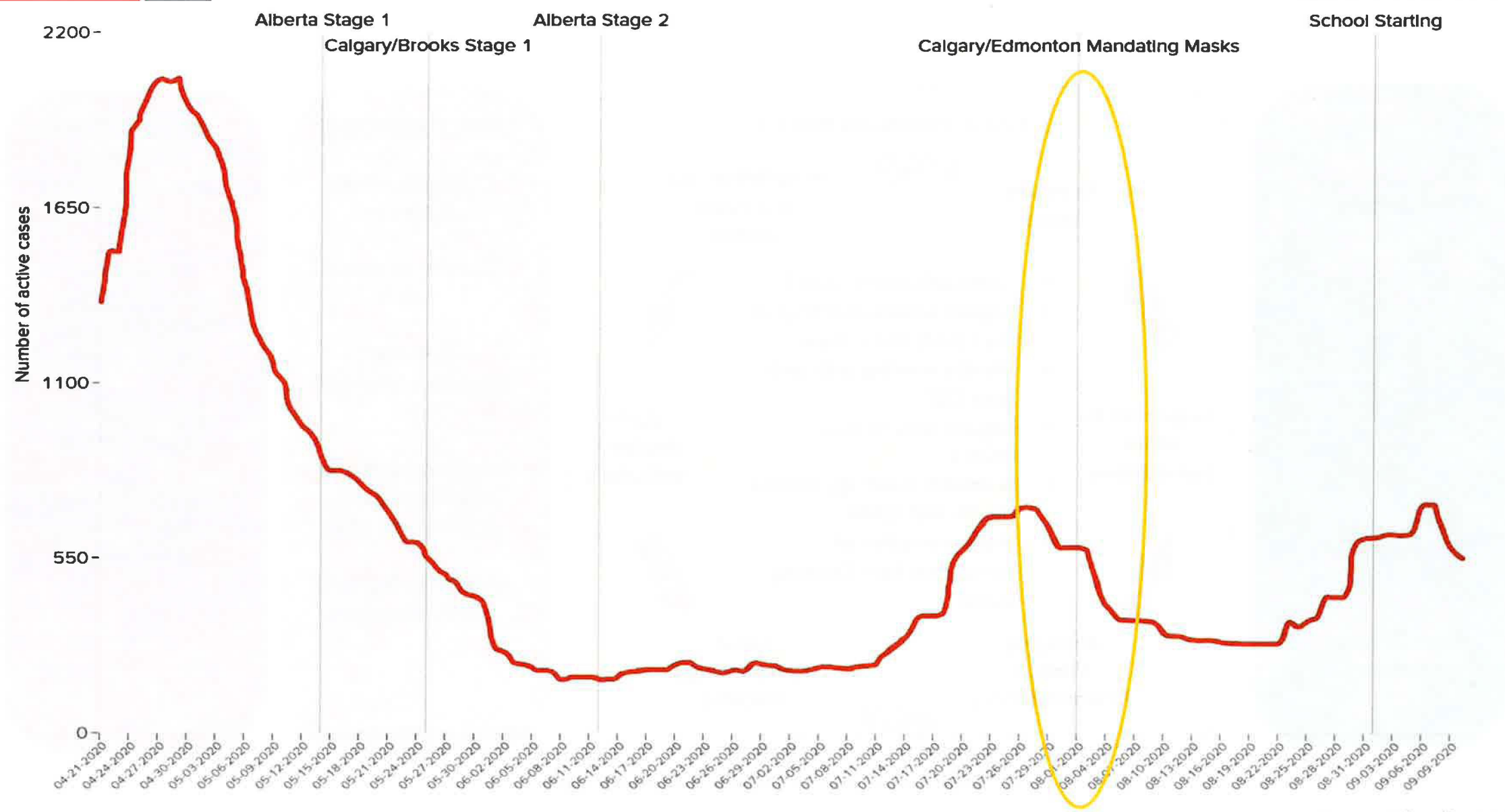

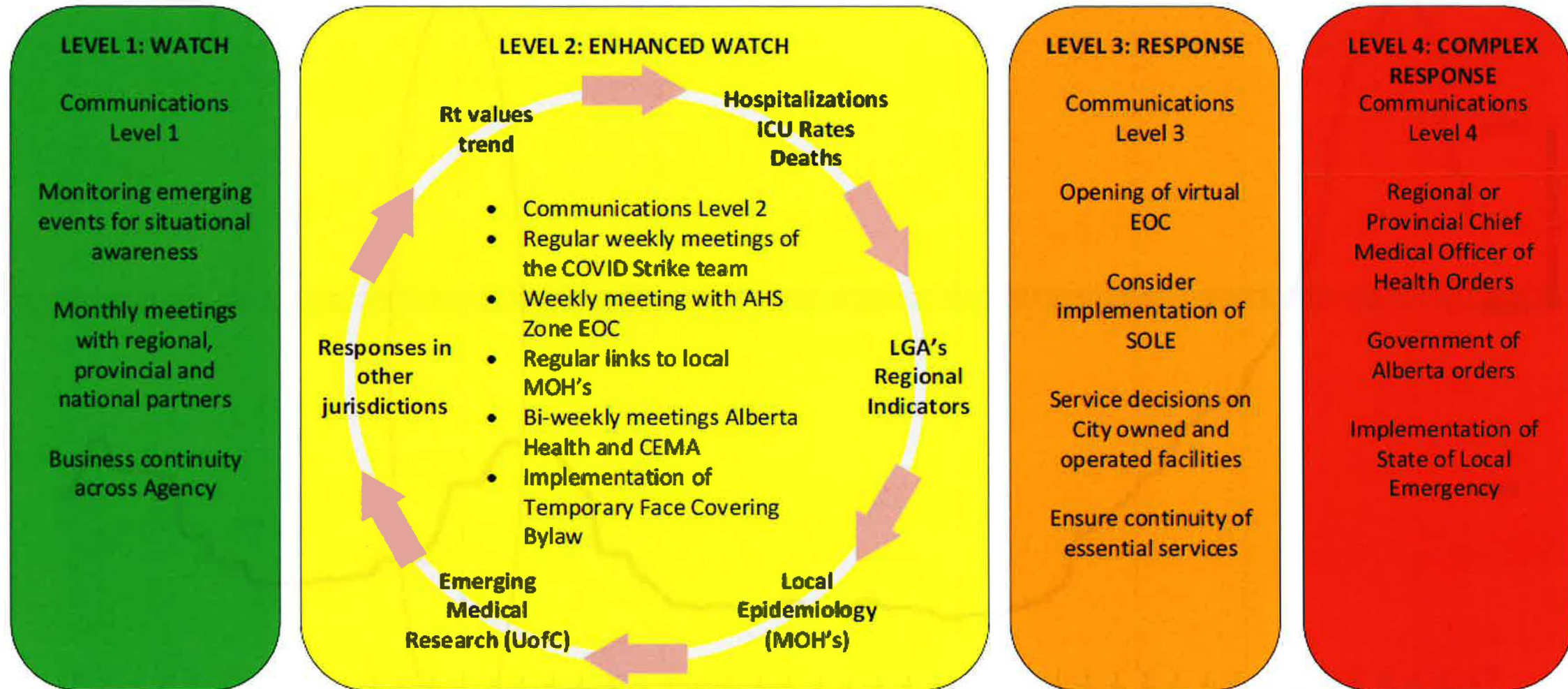
Active Cases in Calgary

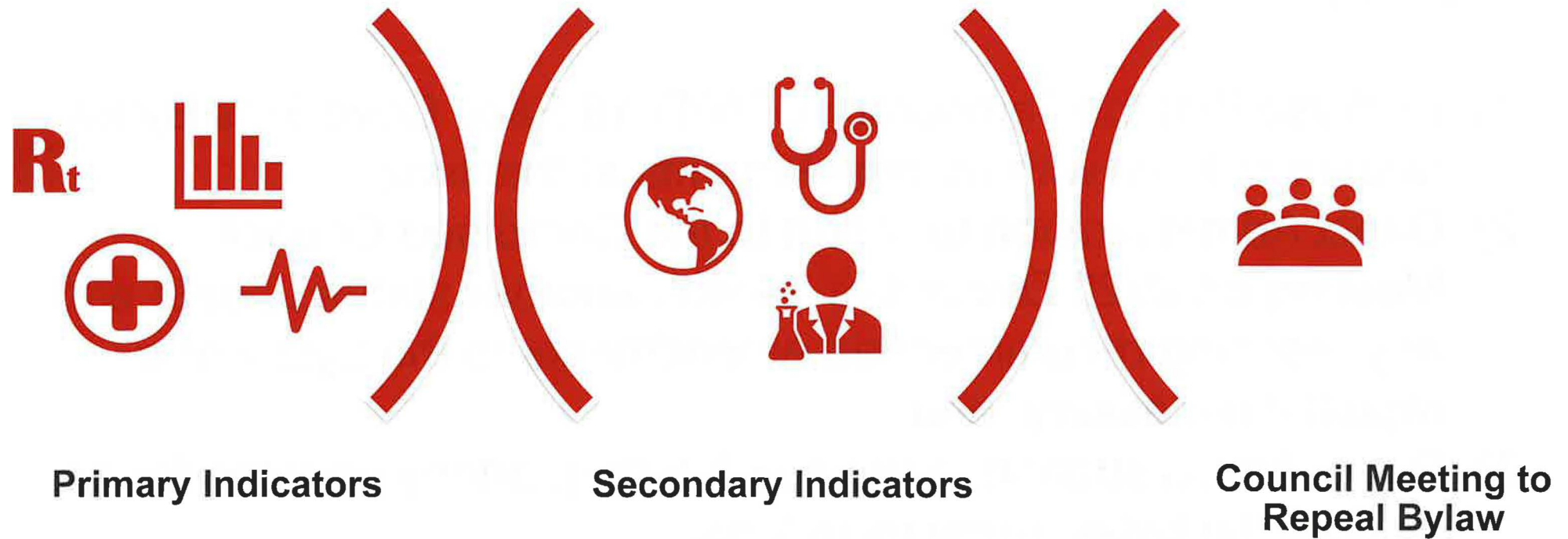


Calgary's Four Level COVID-19 Plan

Repeal Considerations

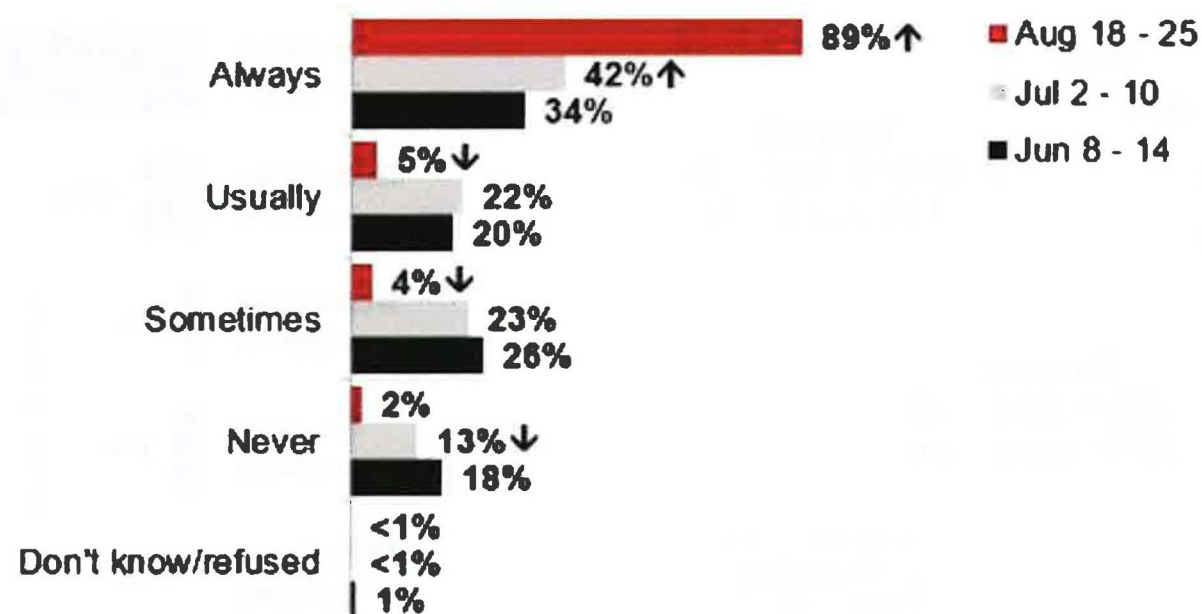


That Council:

- 1) Endorse that the Temporary COVID-19 Face Coverings Bylaw remain in force with no amendments at this time;
- 2) Direct Administration to report to the Combined Council Meeting on 2020 December 14 with another status update and any resulting recommended amendments to the bylaw or a repeal if necessary; and
- 3) Direct Administration to provide future quarterly updates for as long as the bylaw remains in force.

*City Council voted in favour of the Face Coverings Bylaw on July 21, 2020 and it went into effect on August 1, 2020.

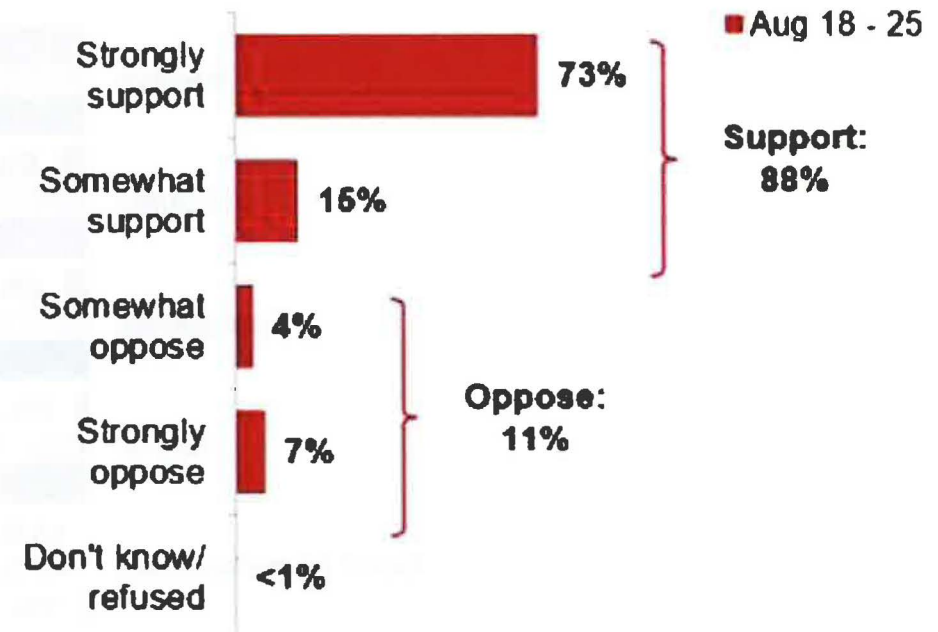
New question beginning June 8
