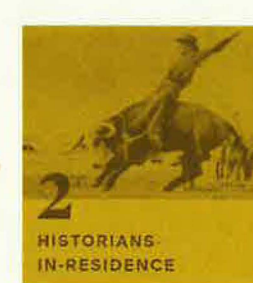
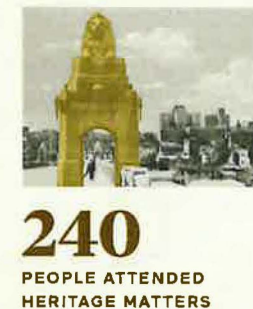

Current State: Impact of COVID-19



- All in-person events had to be canceled, including Heritage Matters and walking tours, namely Jane's Walk and Historic Calgary Week. The Lion Awards were slated for October 2020 but have been moved to Oct 2021.
- Evaluations for the Inventory were paused because institutions essential to research were closed. This work has restarted now that those institutions have reopened. During the hiatus, we focused on conducting windshield surveys that will be essential to Inventory Evaluations slated for the remainder of 2021 and into 2022.
- Staff worked from home from mid-March until returning to the office on June 22.
