Key highlights from 2019

Capacity Change: Successes include the development process and the launch of the refreshed E4A 2.0 strategy and examples of increased collaboration and expansion of networks across sectors.

Awareness and Will Change: 2019 brought several examples of collective advocacy efforts. Efforts made by Basic Income Calgary, The Justice Sector Constellation, PovertyTalks!, The Community Housing Affordability Collective (CHAC) and the Social Policy Collaborative are highlights.

Systemic and Policy change: A key success in 2019 was sustaining existing polices for low income Calgarians. The majority of Champions (75%) believed that VCC is a leader is advancing policy change.
