- Embed Indigenous practices




Indigenous Governance Best Practices Review

- Models are as diverse as Indigenous peoples
- Calgary model should be representative of Treaty 7 Nations, Metis and Urban Indigenous community
- Include: Elders, Indigenous Natural law, Indigenous principles, practices, ethics and protocols

Recommendation

That the Standing Policy Committee on Community and Protective Services recommend Council direct Administration to work with the Indigenous community to cocreate an Indigenous relations governance model for The City of Calgary that aligns with the Indigenous Policy and includes relevant Indigenous governance best practices and provide a progress report back to Council no later than Q4 2021.
