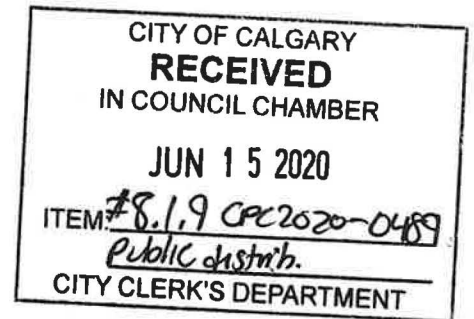

Juniper Drive NW is used by residents, City transit, garbage collection, Canada Post, etc. It is also used by construction crews to access the north side of buildings, currently under construction in Greenwich.

Although Melcor Development Ltd. owns the road, they have been in talks with the City of Calgary, suggesting/ requesting that the City take ownership of this road. Of course, this would include the site in question. The result would be that taxpayers could be on the hook for any future costs associated with damage caused by natural events and proposed construction of a 10 story building, on the historic Romeo & Juliet site.
