Pandemic response measures for the development and building industry

- Business payment relief through application fee structure adjustments
- Preliminary investigation into Off-Site Levy Payment relief for the development industry

- Balances (in millions) have further restrictions based on service line and infrastructure type.
- City Centre Levy is not reflected above, but would be considered. The 2020 opening balance is approximately \$8M.
- Investment income has been excluded.
- Transportation includes Transit busses.
- Community Services includes Fire, Police, Recreation, and Library.



Off-site levy payment relief program - Risks

Key risks of an off-site levy payment relief program include:

- Compounding cash flow and liquidity challenges:
 - Less predictable receipt of payment
 - Utilities' principal and interest payments, normally covered by levy payments
 - Foregone investment income
- Increased risk of developer default and non-collection of outstanding levy payments
- Delay of off-site levy bylaw review and audit implementation



Off-site levy payment relief program - Benefits

Potential benefits of an off-site levy payment relief program include:

- Responding to development industry concerns about nearterm cash flow issues due to the pandemic
- Maintain employment of Calgarians in the development and building industry
- Maintain confidence for industry, financers and lenders that Calgary is open for business
- Maintain growth in tax base and revenue for The City over the long term



Principles of a potential payment relief option

- Maintain the principle of 'Growth Pays for Growth'
- Manage City liquidity and cash flow
- Mitigate risk of non-payment
- Enable economic activity during pandemic recovery
- Transparent approach that maintains the integrity of the off-site levy bylaw and process
