Since I missed these meeting I did leave my feedback on the city online form. I at that time did not see any mention of the proposed dog park.
With low income housing going in how will this be an ideal location for people to live? The couple on the east side must be hard of hearing or soon will be with this barking going on 14hr a day.

I love animals and enjoy the fact that we have a welcoming neighbourhood for all to enjoy but...
if we are to have this sort of park here, the onus needs to be on the pet owners to keep it respectful.

- 1). hours need to be adjusted: perhaps 9 to 8 weekdays and 10 to 8 weekends? a respectful time before one is forced to hear the incessant barks and rough housing of dogs that would be better off being actually walked to get out some energy before playing at the park.
- 2). the buffer area between this park and its immediate neighbour (someone's peaceful home) needs to be extended to run the complete length of this property, not just the rear half
- 3). dogs should be under control and not be allowed to run the fence line barking at individuals passing (as has often happened to me)

We are grateful for the City's consultations with us to date on planning, the facts are:

- A number of people entering this park take the 'Posted' Bylaw and Rules seriously while a large number do not, OR, they choose to ignore them. Doubled with the ongoing increase of people and dog fights, barking at neighbours, PLUS the constant onslaught of noise, safety concerns and verbal abuse continues, so-much-so that it is affecting our daily lives and

well being.

- As the only contiguous home owners we would like to see Bylaw enforcement on a regular and ongoing basis, so that people adhere to these Rules. People need to be accountable for their actions.
 - We, as immediate surrounding residents should not be the ones to have to patrol/monitor 24/7 what goes on.
 - As mentioned in our Oct 23rd 2020 correspondence you cannot fully understand the non-stop disturbances unless you are here to experience it.
 - People have lost their ability to truly exercise and walk their dogs. Instead, most drive to this park, let their dogs run at will, and upset the neighbourhood with excessive, ongoing noise.
- To Reiterate, as long time home owners (30 years) in Mount Pleasant, we are thankful that our concerns, as well as many of our (mutually) concerned neighbours are being heard and hopefully addressed.
