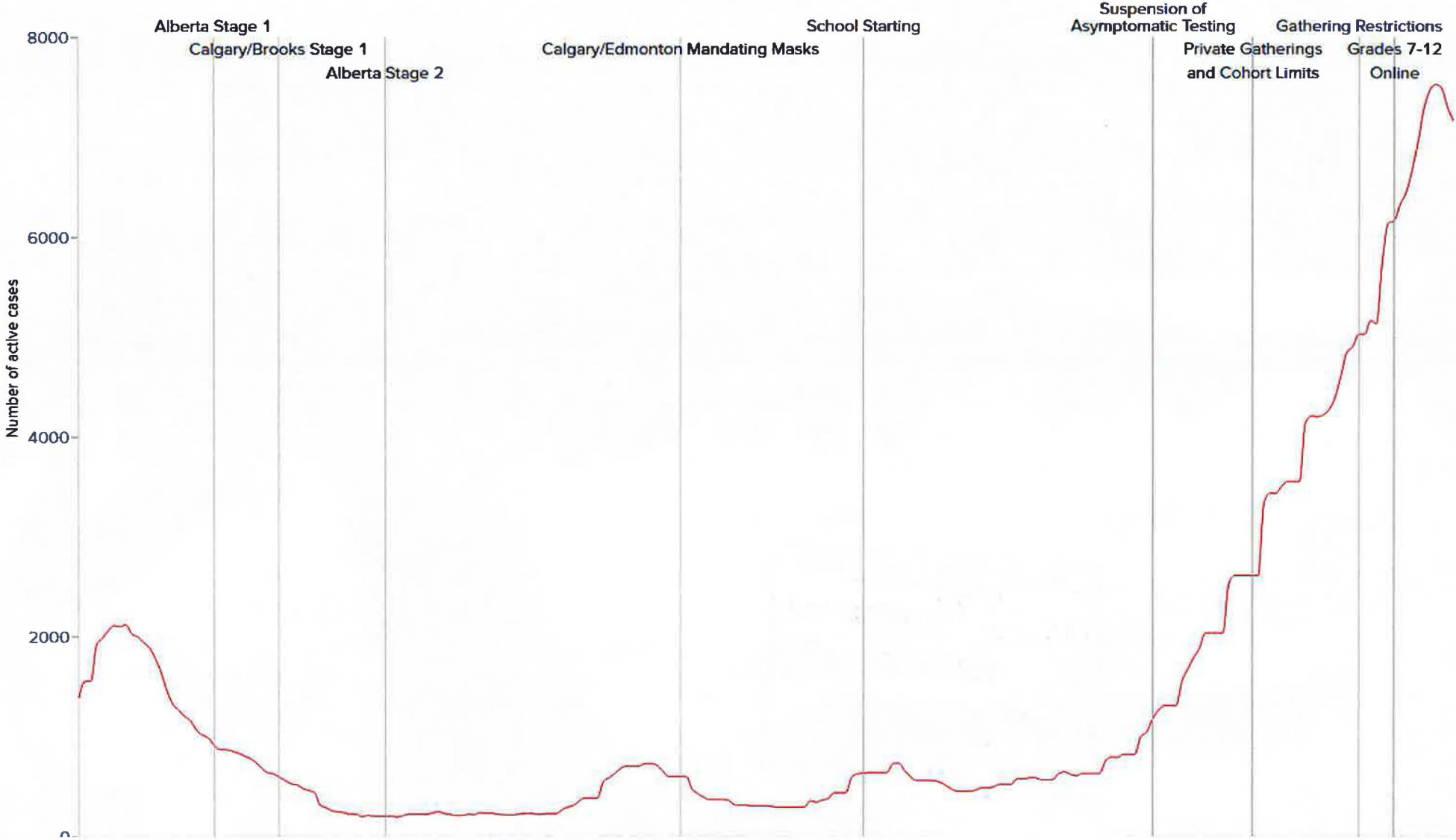

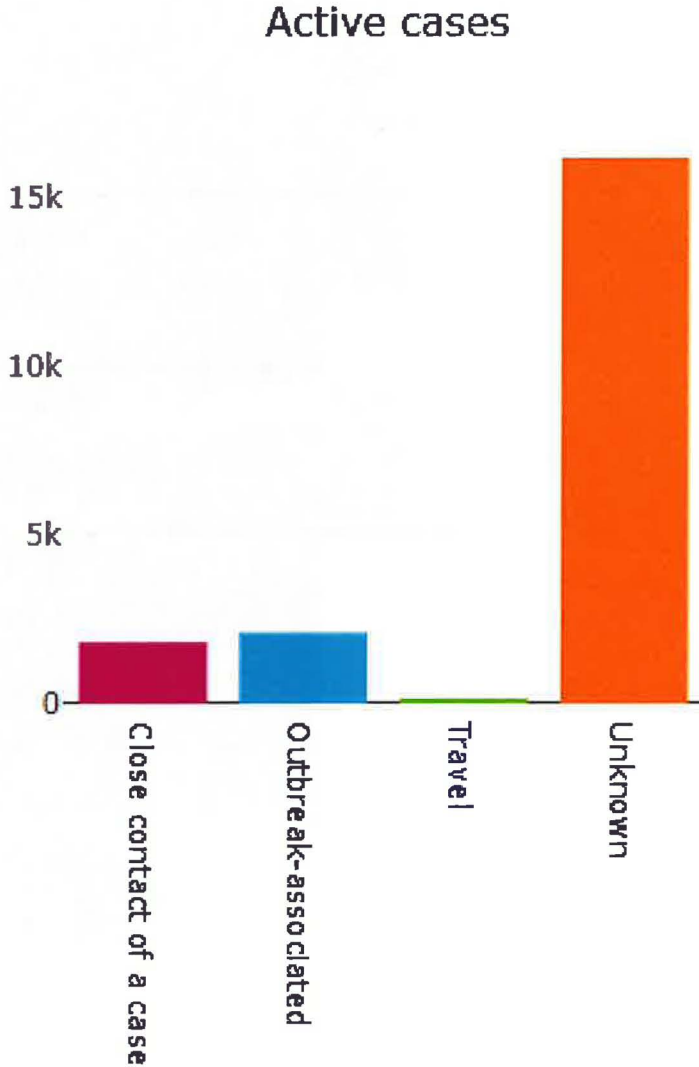
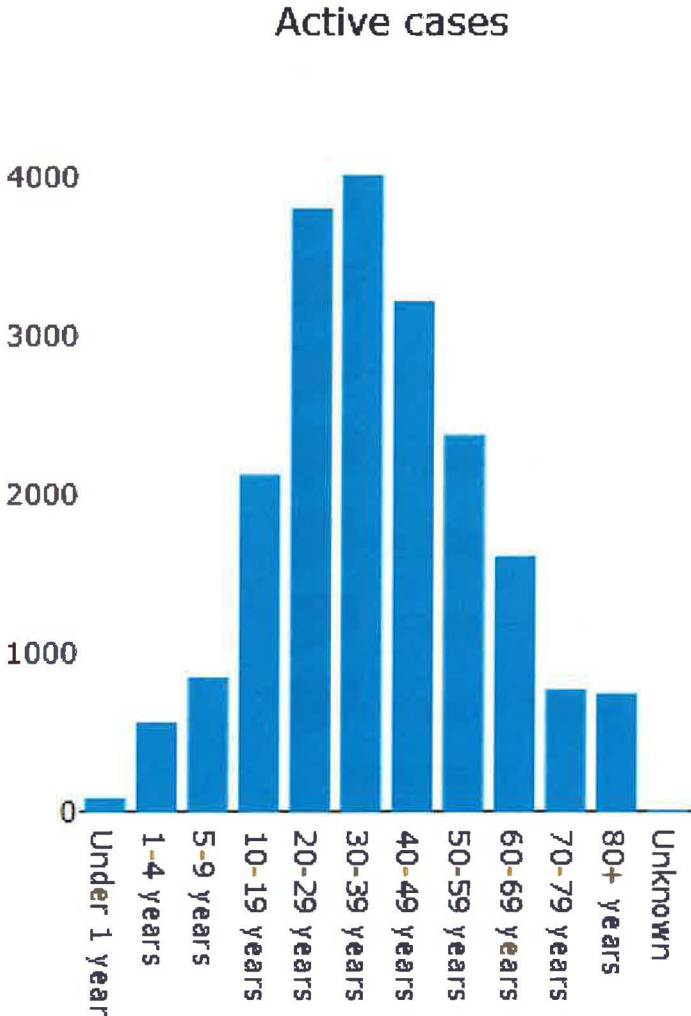

Alberta Active Case Characteristics

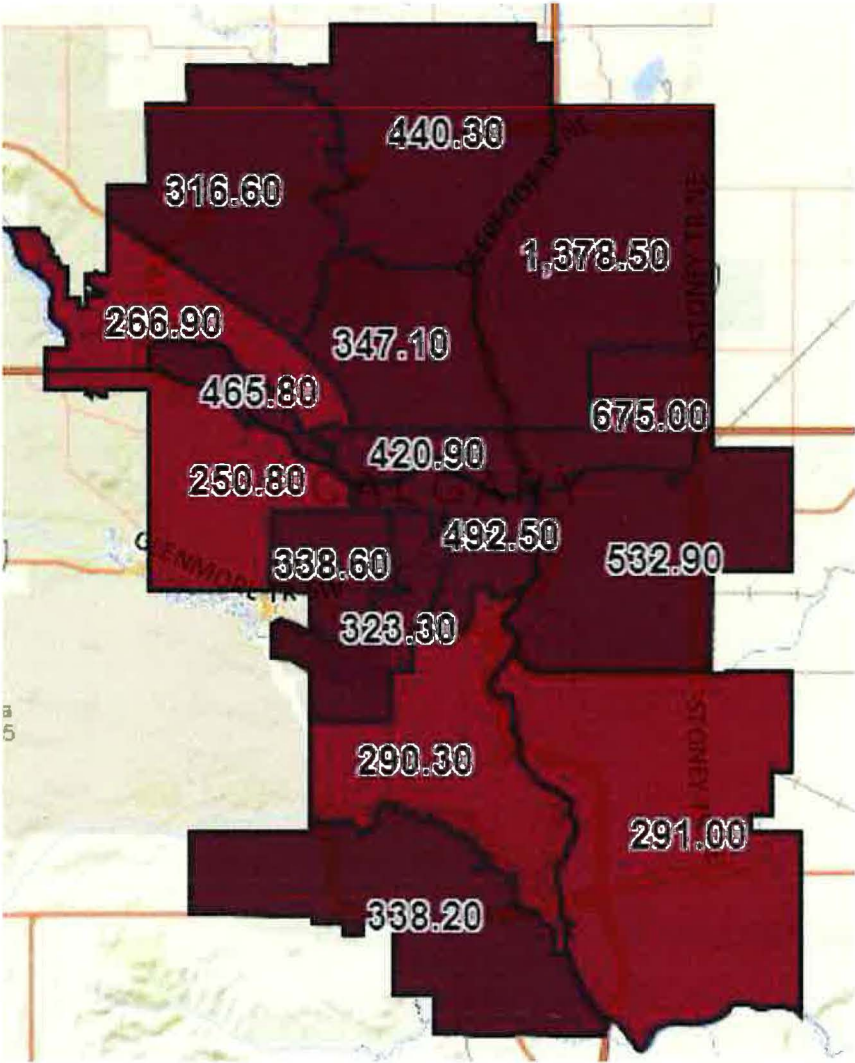
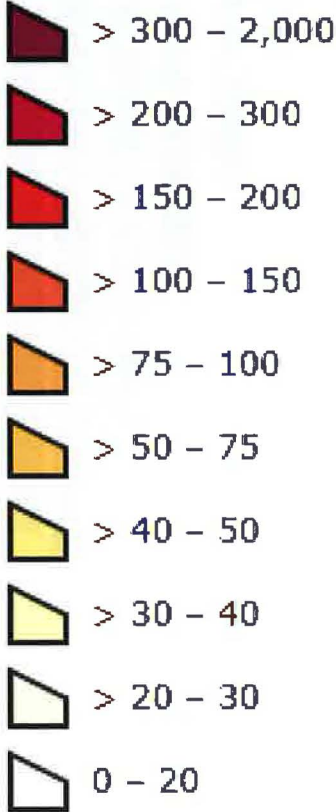

AHS Local Geographic Areas - current

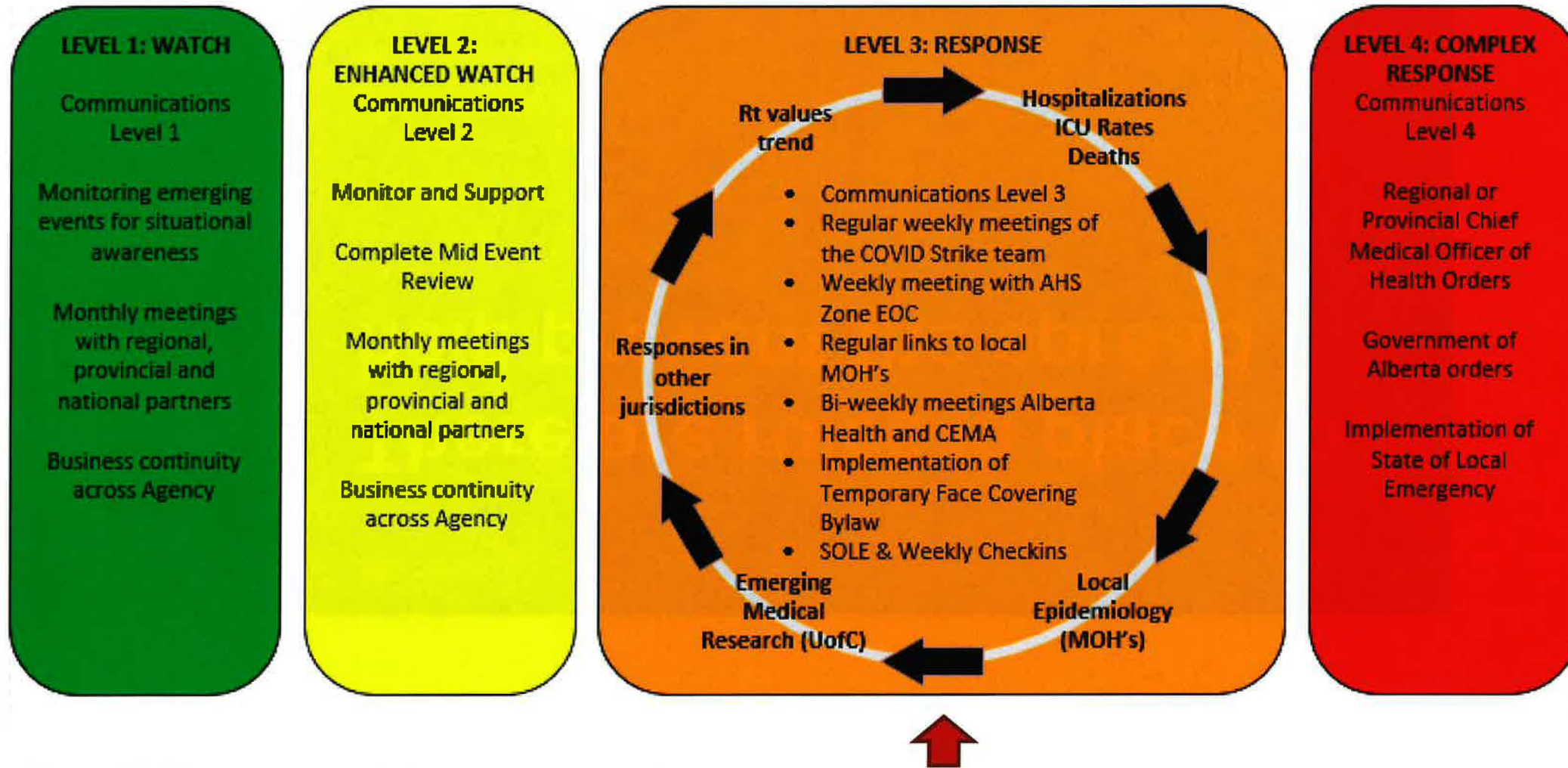
Regional Indicator Value (Cases/100K)

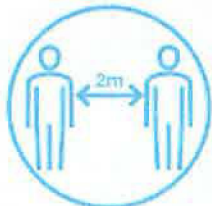

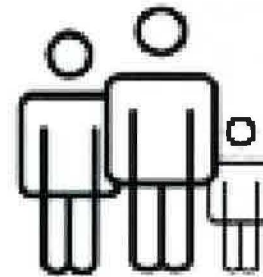

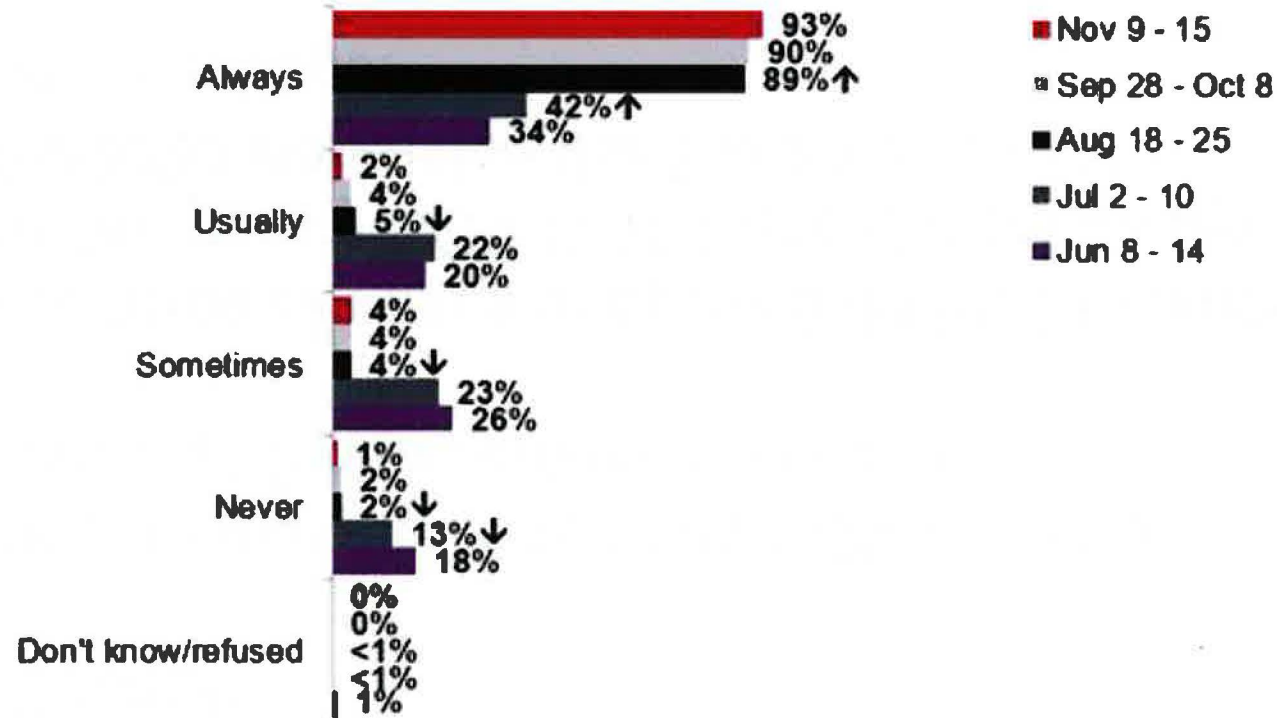
Recommendation

That Council:

1. Endorse that the Temporary COVID-19 Face Coverings Bylaw remain in force; and
2. Give three readings to bylaw 51M2020 to amend the Temporary COVID-19 Face Coverings Bylaw 26M2020 increasing the fine amounts for contraventions.

Frequency of Wearing a Face Mask in Public/Confined Spaces*



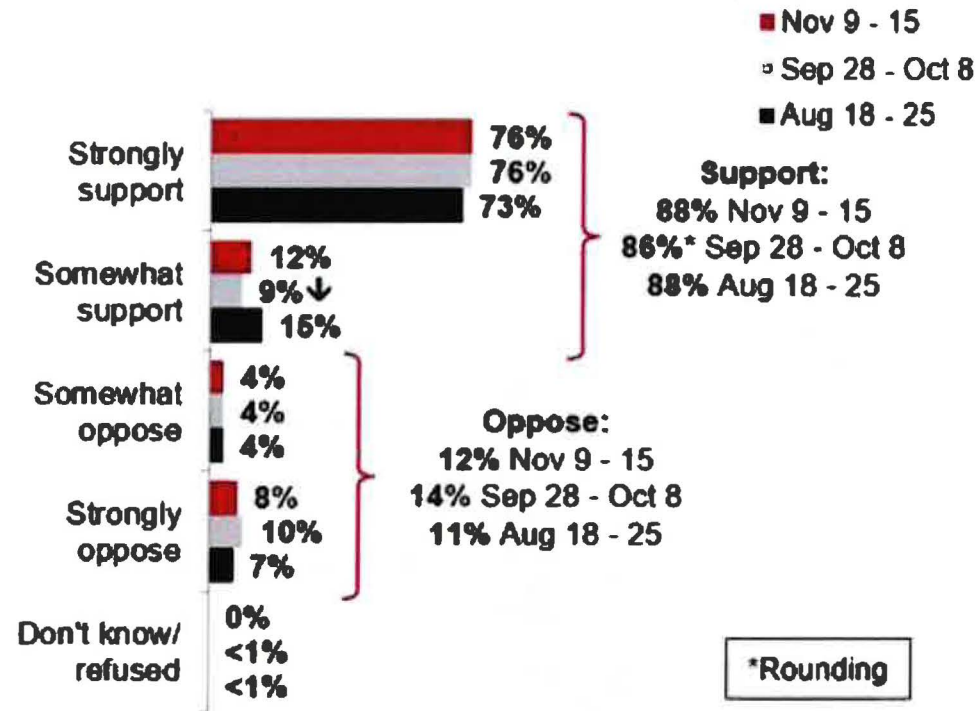
*City Council voted in favour of the Face Coverings Bylaw on July 21, 2020 and it went into effect on August 1, 2020.

Support for Mandatory Face Mask Bylaw for Public Transit and Public Indoor Spaces



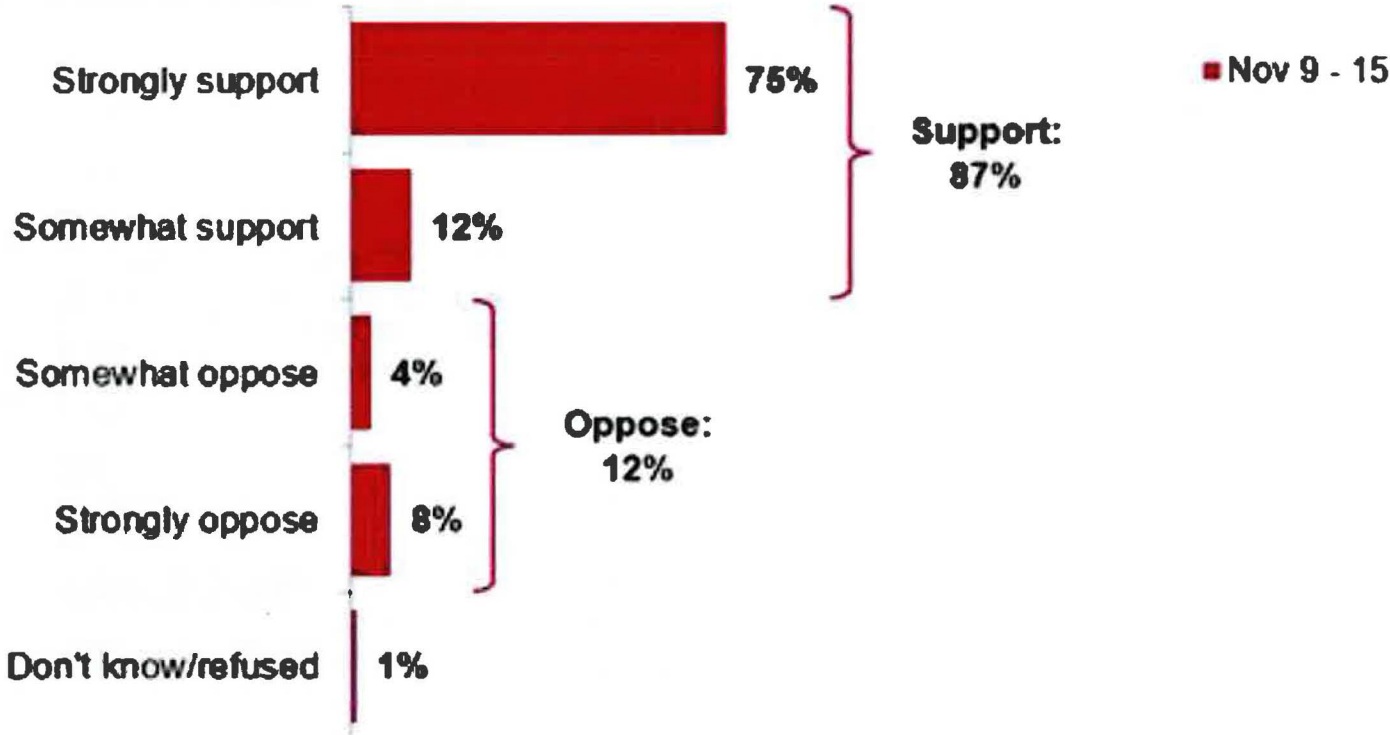
New question beginning August 18

Support for Extending the Duration of the Face Coverings Bylaw



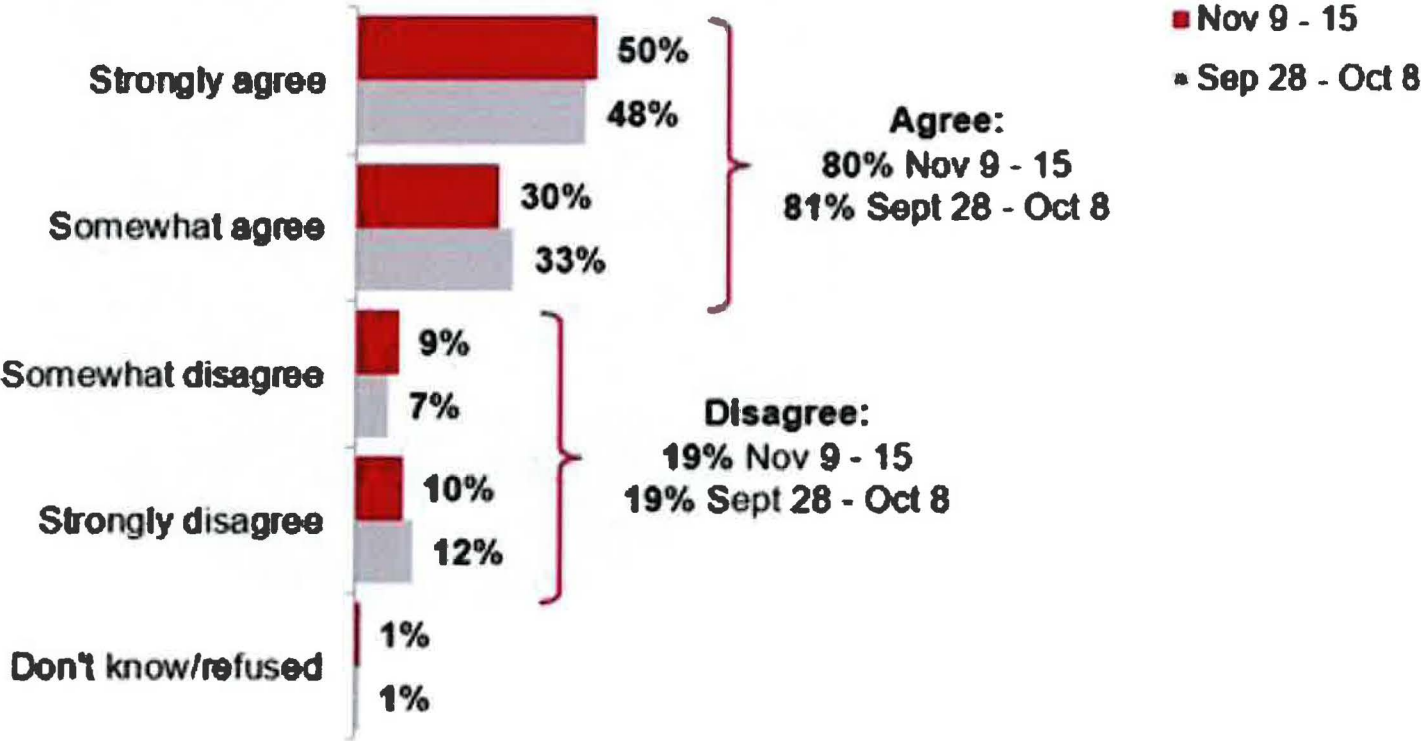
New question beginning November 9
