







### **Alberta Active Case Characteristics**



### **COVID-19 Calgary Local Geographic Areas**





\*Data collection occurred after face coverings bylaw came into effect




### Recommendation

That Council:

- 1. Endorse that the Temporary COVID-19 Face Coverings Bylaw remain in force; and
- Give three readings to bylaw 51M2020 to amend the Temporary COVID-19 Face Coverings Bylaw 26M2020 increasing the fine amounts for contraventions.

\*City Council voted in favour of the Face Coverings Bylaw on July 21, 2020 and it went into effect on August 1, 2020.






#### New question beginning August 18


