   January (C2016-0023) to establish a closer working relationship and
   partnership between The City and the land development and building industry
   and to create increased accountability around process improvements and
   work related to growth matters.
- This work plan is established and governed by the Developer Advisory
  Committee including City staff and representatives from the development
  industry.
- In past years, the City Planning & Policy Work Plan and the Industry-City Work Plan have been brought forward concurrently to City Council.
- Administration and Industry will continue to evolve the Industry-City Work
  Plan to exist more productively with other work planning in the Planning &
  Development Department.



### Overview


Industry and The City are committed to advancing initiatives set out in the Industry-City Work Plan.

Monthly Developer Advisory Committee meetings are held to monitor deliverables and receive updates about service delivery.


The Industry-City Work Plan is an important strategy to improve the context for development in Calgary which ensures positive planning outcomes for Calgarians.




# Reflecting on 2020
