- January 2020
 - Referral of questions to responsive Business Units
 - Framework for development of questions distributed



Vote Vote on a Question

- Vote on a question "on any matter over which the municipality has jurisdiction".
- Outcome is not binding on Council.
- A question must be simple, clear, direct and concise.
- Electors should be able to understand the context of a question (e.g., timing, scope and application).



- A question must be capable of being answered with a "yes" or "no," or "for" or "against".
 Electors may choose not to respond to a question.
- A question should be as neutral and impartial as possible, and not suggest a 'correct' or desired outcome.
- Electors should be informed about what the vote outcome will mean.



- Elector is, as of Election Day (2021 October 18) a person who is:
 - At least 18 years old;
 - A Canadian Citizen; and
 - A resident of the city of Calgary.
- Returning Officer's role is to impartially administer a vote on questions submitted by Council.
- Once Council submits a question, Administration plays a limited role, providing factual information.



Vote Vote on a Question

- More efficient to conduct vote of the electors at the same time as a General Election
- \$50,000 cost, includes:
 - Potentially larger ballot.
 - Vote tabulator programming and testing support.



Vote Vote on a Question

- Complex election for voters:
 - Additional matters anticipated
 - Senate
 - Provincial Referendum questions
 - COVID impacts
 - Additional time to consider choices
 - Additional time in voting station



- To provide for the submission of a question for a vote of the electors, Council would make a resolution.
- Question(s) must be received by the Returning
 Officer no later than the end of Q2, 2021.
