



Verbal Report to the 2021 February 18 Meeting of the Intergovernmental Affairs Committee



June 2020 – Minister of Justice and Solicitor General proposed questions for review, about possibility of legislation for:

- Recall of Members of the Legislative Assembly (MLAs)
- Recall of municipal elected officials and school board trustees



- <u>Submissions to the Committee</u> respecting municipal recall legislation were from a range of organizations and individuals.
- Opposition was from, amongst others:
  - Alberta Urban Municipalities Association (AUMA)
  - Rural Municipalities of Alberta (RMA)
- Submissions in support from others:
  - For recall legislation similar to that allowing recall of Members of the Legislative Assembly



November 2020 – Select Special Democratic Accountability Committee

<u>Final Report Citizen's Initiatives and Recall report</u>

- Recommends MLA recall legislation
- Recommends Municipal Elected Official and School Board Trustee recall legislation:
  - (a) recall legislation be enacted for the purpose of recalling of municipal elected officials or school board trustees, and
  - (b) such legislation be similar in nature to recall legislation in respect of Members of the Legislative Assembly.



#### Framework recommended by Committee for recall of MLAs:

- o Only one recall petition respecting an MLA allowed at a time, and per term
- No recall petitions permitted within 6 months of fixed election period, nor
   within 18 months after a general election or by-election in the electoral division
- Successful petition = at least 40% of registered electors of the electoral division to validly sign the petition
- Physical signatures only
- Only electors eligible during 90-day period when signatures permitted to be collected are counted as valid



### Framework recommended by Committee for recall of MLAs (Cont'd):

- Chief Electoral Officer will determine whether a recall petition is successful
- Limits on contributions to proponents of a recall petition, or to MLA subject to recall petition, as well as financing, advertising and disclosure rules
- Third-Party advertiser restrictions
- Requirements for issuance of a recall petition
- o Prospectively, a three-part process to replace an elected MLA:
  - Recall Petition
  - 2. Recall Election
  - 3. By-Election (recalled MLA can be a candidate)
