




COVID Executive Response Group COFLEX Program Highlights





Calgary Active Cases





Vaccination Update - Phase 2, Groups A to D

Group A

- Albertans aged 65-74, no matter where they live
- First Nations, Inuit, and Metis people aged 50-64, on and off reserve or Metis Settlements
- Staff and residents of licensed supportive living (seniors) not included in Phase 1

Group B

- Albertans aged 18-64 with high-risk underlying health conditions
- Specific conditions will be provided prior to Phase 2 roll-out

Group C

- Residents and staff of eligible congregate living settings: correctional facilities, homeless shelters, group homes
 including disability, mental health, and other types of supportive living
- Health-care workers providing direct and acute patient care who have a high potential for spread to high-risk individuals
- Caregivers of Albertans who are most at risk of severe outcomes

Group D

- Albertans aged 50-64, no matter where they live
- First Nations, Inuit and Metis people aged 35-49 on and off reserve or Metis Settlements


