

\$10 household cost for program








Hi! I'm RoadBot, a virtual agent. I can help you with your Street Cleaning questions.

How The City Fixes Potholes

After the tack coat is applied the pot hole is filled with asphalt.



Then City crews remove any loose material, debris and water from the pothole. This is done using equipment like shovels and picks to remove debris and a torch to remove water.



Once the pothole is filled it is compacted using a roller. The asphalt is compacted until it is level with the roadway.







