



Completion of The City of Calgary's 2013 Southern Alberta Flood Disaster Recovery Program

- \$295M in damages
- 252 projects submitted for recovery funding (including Emergency Operations recoveries)
- Recovery rate for Emergency Operations was 99.2%
- Recovery rate for Infrastructure was 80.2%
- Total DRP costs recovered by The City of Calgary (including Emergency, Recovery and Infrastructure): \$137 million
- Fiscal Stability Reserve funding held for recovery that is not required and can be released: \$81 million
