Re: Community Standards Bylaw Review Summary of Proposed Amendments

Section	Proposed (New)	Rationale
Part 5 – Fire Pits	Fires in Firepits Section 16(1)(h) New provision that requires wood-burning fire pits to be covered with a non- combustible mesh screen with openings no greater than 1.24 cm.	A mesh screen will reduce sparks and embers and nuisance impacts of fire pits on neighbouring properties.
	Schedule A Increase fines for unsafe fire pits and burning prohibited materials (from current \$500 to \$750)	This will address citizen concerns about fire safety and provide a stronger deterrent for burning of prohibited materials that increase smoke.
Part 9 – Noise	Outdoor Concerts Section 33.1(1)New section that adds a limit of 85decibels (dBC) to reduce noise-inducedvibrations from bass sound.Schedule AIncrease fines for noise over the allowable	The sound study found that a 85 dBC limit at residences near concert venues would reduce the impact of concert bass sound while still allowing for an enjoyable concert experience at the venue. This will maintain the deterrent for repeat noise offences.
5.	 limit (specified penalties on tickets): from \$100 to \$250 for sound in excess of prescribed level from \$100 to \$500 outdoor speakers when prohibited \$500 for outdoor concert noise (new) 	
Part 11 – Weeds and Grass	Schedule A Increase fines for long grass and weeds (from current \$300 to \$400)	This will maintain the deterrent for repear offences for long grass and weeds.

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Part 4 – Untidy	Outdoor Storage of Building Materials Section 10	Provisions were revised for greater clarity and enforceability.
Properties	This section was deleted and the provisions were incorporated in Section 8.

3	Increase fines for the accumulation of materials • from \$100 to \$200 visible material • from \$300 to \$500 offensive material • from \$200 to \$500 harmful fluids • from \$200 to \$500 improper storage of building materials	This will maintain the deterrent effect for offences that cause an unsightly condition, create a public safety concern, or attract pests.
Part 10 – Nuisances	Flyers and Debris Section 44(4) Expand the commercial flyers provision to include non-commercial flyers when a 'no- flyer' sign is displayed at a dwelling.	This will address nuisances related to recycling unwanted flyers, limiting the volume of unwanted flyers causing public litter; the privacy rights of homeowners to limit the purpose for which members of the public are entitled to enter into their private property; and the rights of parents to control their children's access to materials received in their homes.
		The provision would not apply to election advertising material, paid newspaper delivery, community association newsletters, and information produced by government, government agencies and elected officials.
Part 12 – Maintenance of Buildings/ Structures	Obligation to Maintain Section 50(1) Reference to "safety hazard" was replaced with "unsightly condition".	Provisions and definitions revised to clarify that the focus is on nuisance impacts. Safety hazards are addressed through the Safety Codes Act and Building Maintenance Bylaw.
