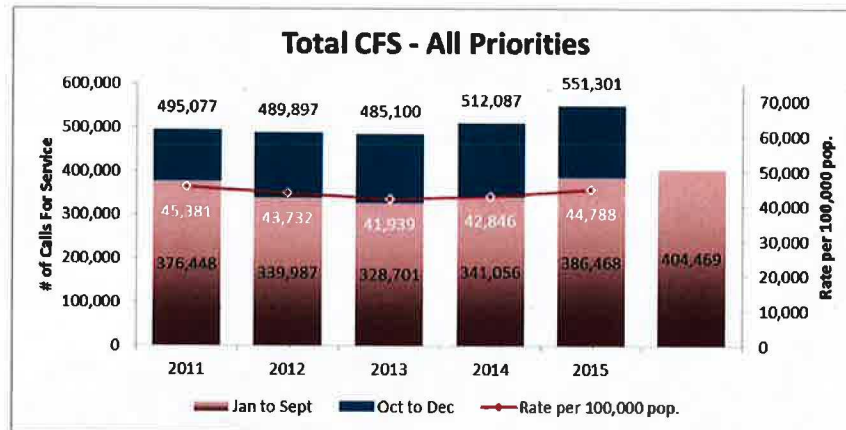

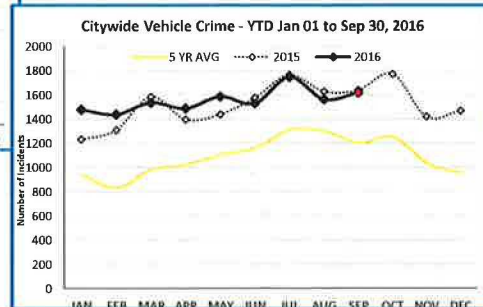
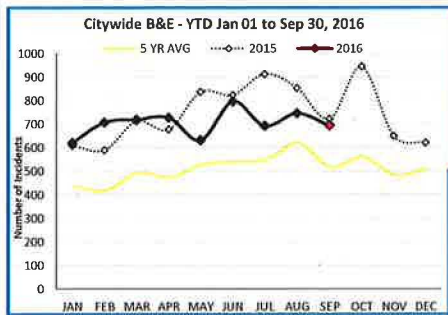


Current Situation - Trends

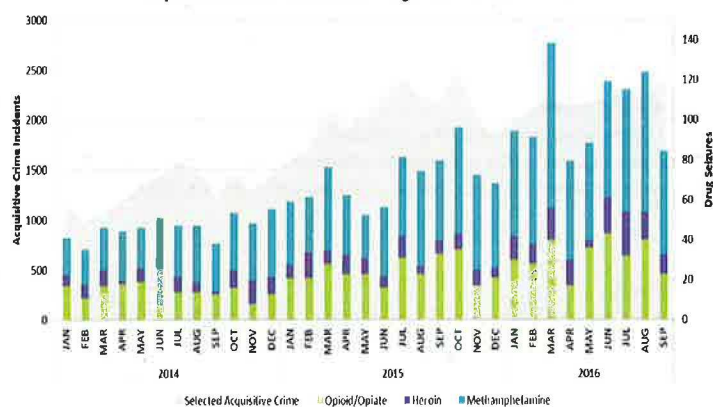


Current Situation – Crime Trends

Offenders are diversifying in the types of crimes they commit and are engaged in acquisitive crime that results in property or cash including: shoplifting, car-prowlings, break and enters, and home invasions.



Crime Reduction Strategy



TRAFFIC

- * Developed and implemented the Residential Traffic Safety Plan.
- * Ward Town Hall Safety Meetings.
- * Enhanced School Zone Enforcement and Education.



DRUG ADDICTION

- * From January to September 2016, 338 Albertans died from apparent drug overdose related to fentanyl or another opioid.
- * Fentanyl and methamphetamine abuse leads to increased criminal offences.



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- * 36 per cent more domestic violence incidents year to date in 2016, than the five year average.
- * Domestic Violence Response Strategy responds to families at risk and seeks to increase coordination with community and government agencies.



BREAK AND ENTERS

- * House and Commercial B&E's remains higher than average year to date.
- * Break & Enter Strategy includes more targeted enforcement, expanded investigative activities, and more proactive monitoring and public education.



Crime Reduction Strategy



GANGS

- * Curb gang violence through identifying at-risk youth and diverting them into pro-social activities & coordinate management strategies for high-risk gang offenders released from corrections institutions.



OFFENDER ENGAGEMENT

- * Reduce crime rates and risk to the community by creating a comprehensive and partnership orientated approach to offender management. With the goal of reducing recidivism of prolific career criminals and high-risk offenders.



CYBERCRIME

- * Impacts individuals, families, small businesses, corporations and national economies.
- * The Cybercrime strategy will reduce the threat, impact and victimization in Calgary.



Legal Environment – R v. Jordan

- The Supreme Court of Canada R v. Jordan decision **guarantees any person charged with an offence the right to be tried within a reasonable time.**
- The decision impacts the CPS investigative approaches and deadlines, as well as disclosure processes and officer training.
- The CPS is working with the crown and adjusting internal investigative approaches to ensure we meet the new structured trial timelines.
