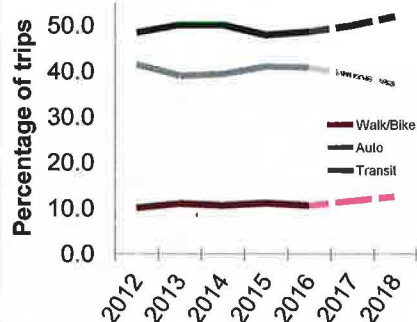

### Story Behind Performance

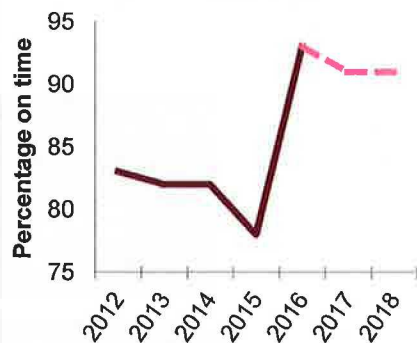
- More Calgarians are using affordable and sustainable travel, choosing to walk, cycle or use transit.
