



Bylaw Review Process



All pillars of the review process informed recommended bylaw amendments





The proposed updated bylaw:



Is aligned
with citizen
expectations



Will increase
public safety
& liveability
related to pet
ownership



Will improve
enforceability



Summary of Major Proposed Changes



- Grant authority to the **Chief Bylaw Officer to designate animals vicious** rather than the Provincial Court
- **Expand the nuisance designation** to allow conditions to be placed on an animal that are meant to mitigate concerns and rehabilitate the animal

Summary of Major Proposed Changes



- Allow urban hens under a program that **ensures proper care of hens and mitigates nuisance concerns**
- **Training** will be required for urban hen owners

Summary of Major Proposed Changes



- **Limit ownership to six cats and six dogs per household with an excess permit available to breeders and animal foster homes**
- **Limit the number of dogs in an off-leash area to six per person**
