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# **Key Messages**

- Council directed \$17.6 million to waive business licensing and related fees for two years starting in 2021 March
- This report includes recommendations for the remaining \$12.4 million, for a total of \$30 million in relief for businesses
- Two components of proposed package: hotel/motel property tax relief, and a reopening grant for businesses significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic
  - Proposing 2021 municipal and provincial tax deferral for hotels and motels until end of 2022
  - Also proposing \$2,500 reopening grant available to restaurants, pubs, bars, entertainment establishments (including night clubs), and fitness centres


# Calgary 2021 Tax Deferral – Hotels and Motels

- Increases cash flow for hotel and motel property owners
- 93 estimated qualifying properties
- Total 2021 municipal and provincial property tax deferred: \$19.5 million
- Cost to The City to defer municipal and provincial taxes until Dec. 31, 2022: \$2.9 million





# Calgary Reopening Grant Eligibility and Criteria



- \$2,500 available to approximately 3,800 businesses across Calgary
- Support for businesses significantly impacted by the pandemic:
  - o Restaurants
  - $\circ$  Pubs
  - $\circ$  Bars
  - Entertainment Establishments (including Night Clubs)
  - Fitness Centres



## Calgary Reopening Grant Eligibility and Criteria

- Applications open July 2, 2021 until August 10, 2021 or until funds are exhausted
- More detailed eligibility and criteria in Attachment 3, with additional details released in June
- Cost to The City for grant
  program: \$9.5 million

- Canada Emergency Business Account Interest-free loans for small businesses and not-for-profits – recently extended
- Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy Rent and mortgage support for qualifying organizations affected by COVID-19
- Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy Help for businesses to keep or rehire employees
- Business Credit Availability Program
  Credit to help cover operating costs due to
  COVID-19
- Highly Affected Sectors Credit
  Availability Program
  Low-interest loans to cover operational
  needs for hard-hit businesses
- Large Employer Emergency
  Financing Facility
  Bridge financing for Canada's largest
  employers facing financial challenges

- Small and Medium Enterprise
  Relaunch Grant
  Third round extended to June 30, 2021
- Alberta Jobs Now
  Opened May 20, 2021 to support businesses
  and not-for-profits to hire up to 20 new staff
- Stabilize Live Music Program
  Opened mid-May to provide grants to
  support musicians and for-profit music
  venues
- Tourism Levy Abatement Extension Accommodation providers are permitted to keep tourism levy amounts collected between April 1, 2021 and June 30, 2021.



### That Council direct Administration to:

1. **\*REVISED\*** Allow hotel/motel non-residential property owners who have not paid their 2021 property taxes to be considered for a deferral of 2021 municipal and provincial property taxes by this program, without penalties, to 2022 December 31, and provide a Report to Council no later than 2021 Q3 with a list of roll numbers of qualifying properties for approval.

2. Develop and administer a Calgary Reopening Grant for Restaurants, Pubs, Bars, Entertainment Establishments (including Night Clubs), and Fitness Centres based on the eligibility and criteria outlined in Attachment 3, and provide a Briefing Note to Council no later than 2021 Q4 with a list of businesses and the amount received through the program.
