




Administration's Recommendations

That the Priorities and Finance Committee recommend that Council:

- 1. Approve the recommendations of the Richmond Green 'Needs Assessment' contained in Attachment 2.
- 2. Approve the cost of sale items contained in the Needs Assessment (Attachment 2) and approve an increase of \$7.429 million in 2022 in the capital budget in the Golf Course Redevelopment Budget ID A403784, funded by the sale proceeds from the approximately 5.5 acres land disposition at Richmond Green. These funds to be maintained within the Real Estate Services reserve. In addition, Council direct the balance of sale proceeds shown in Confidential Attachment 3 to Calgary Recreation (Golf).
- 3. Attachment 3 remain confidential pursuant to Section 25 (Disclosure harmful to economic and other interests of a public body) of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, to be reviewed 2026 May 01.
