As a new father I am extremely concerned about the proposal to repeal the city mask bylaw. As my newborn cannot get a vaccine he is most vulnerable. The long term effects of COVID-19 are not understood, especially in babies whose respiratory and immune systems are still developing. My wife and I have been able to manage our risk through her pregnancy and early days of my child's life throughout the pandemic because of the mask requirement. Repealing the requirement will remove our ability to manage risk. We have not gone to restaurants, gatherings, or anywhere that we may expose ourselves or our child to COVID. Keeping the mask bylaw will allow us (and many of our peers) to manage our risk and still allow us to safely attend Dr's appointments, or to support the local economy.

Why is council requiring masks in public buildings and public transit while removing the requirement in other indoor public spaces if masks do not protect us? I will continue to wear a mask indoors, but that will not adequately protect my newborn. I have spoken to several shop owners and public-facing workers who are terrified that they will have to face tens or hundreds of unmasked people each day while performing their jobs. Most people believe that if they are fully vaccinated, COVID (plus variants) are not an issue, but it is an issue for my child as he cannot be vaccinated and cannot wear a

mask. Transmission occurs to and from those with a full vaccine.

With Stampede occurring there will be a surge in COVID transmission, masks in indoor places will help to reduce transmission and allow everyone to manage their own risk. Masks have been politicized, I don't know why. They are a form of PPE that protects everyone and although a slight inconvenience, they do not cause harm.

I would like to encourage council to extend the mask bylaw until children have the opportunity to be vaccinated against covid-19. There are still high percentages of our population that are unable to be vaccinated yet due to them being under the age of twelve or due to various medical conditions. It seems a small price to pay to require a mask that would help cut down any additional spread within these vulnerable populations. Especially since people have gotten used to wearing them over the last year. I know the argument is that covid doesn't seem to affect kids as harshly as others but the truth of the matter is we don't know what the long term consequences might be and it is better to keep our children from catching covid than to just shrug it off as they will probably be fine. I understand extending it until kids can be vaccinated might be a tough sell (although the best possible scenario) so I urge council at the very least to extend it to the end of July to help cut down on spread during Stampede. Stampede has the potential to be place of higher covid spread among groups of the population that have lower vaccination rates or who may not be as mindful of safe covid practices. A legal mandate may help encourage a higher adherence to the rules which would hopefully limit spread within attendees of the Stampede and the greater community.
