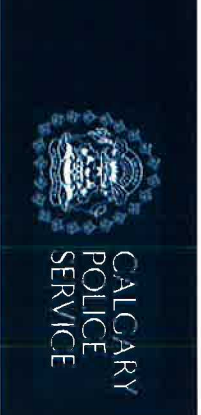

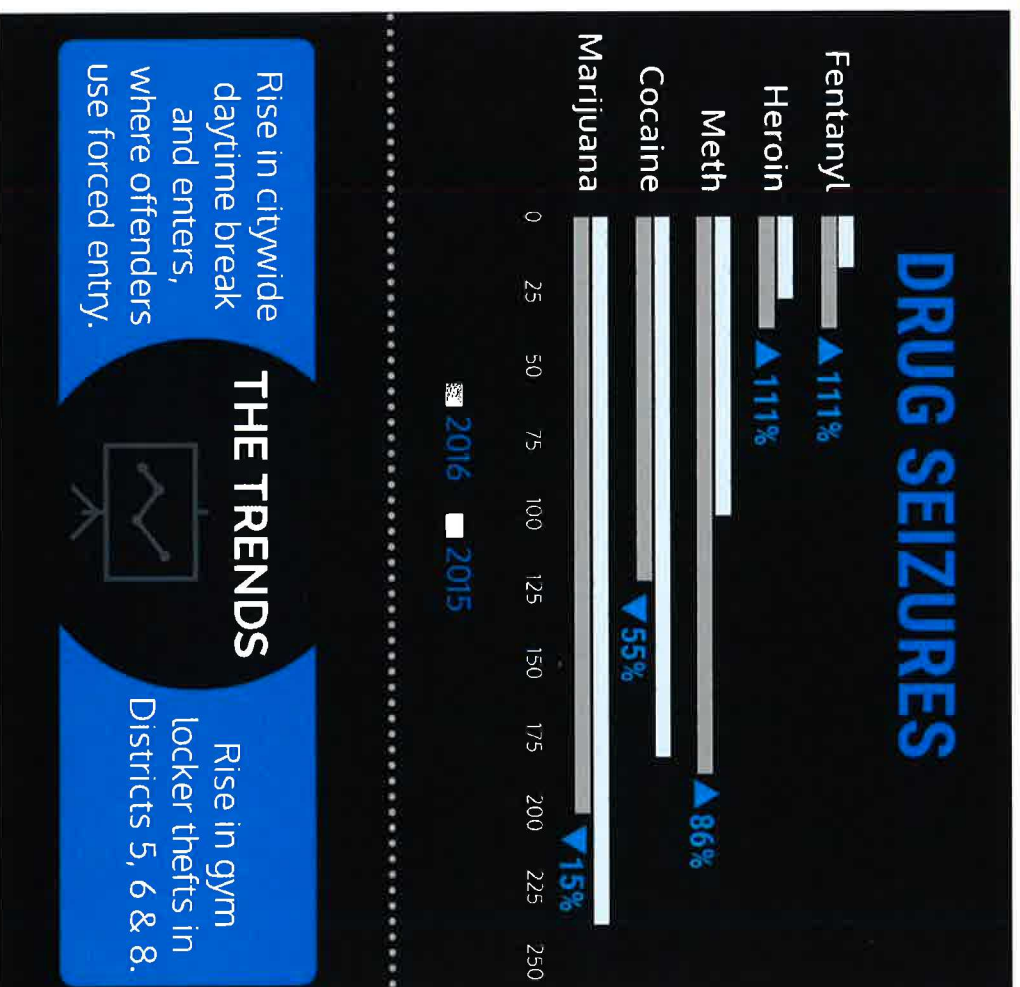

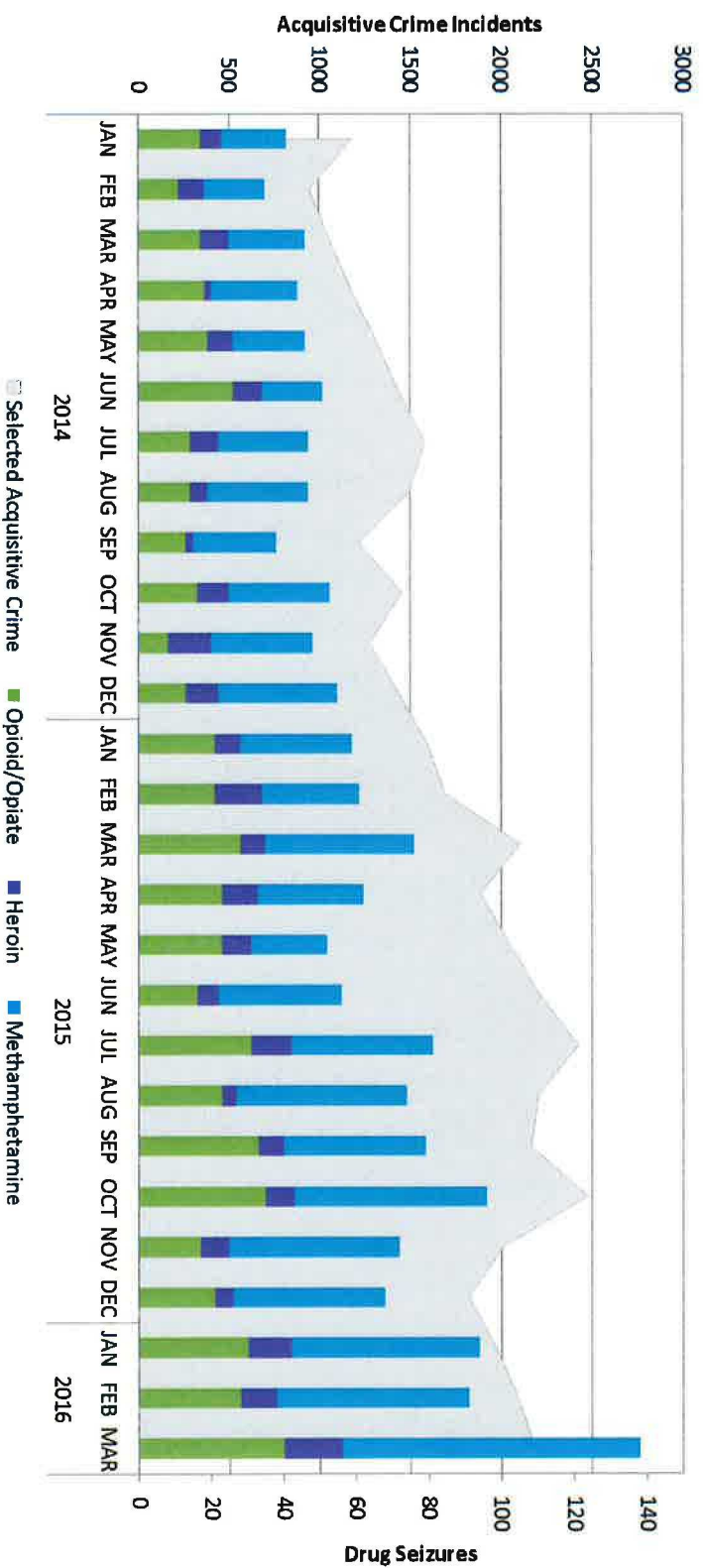

Social Issues - Overview



95 shootings in 2015... double that of 2014

- More than half organized crime related
- 15 resulted in homicides
- 22 shootings to date in 2016, compared to 25 during same time in 2015



Public health crisis lacking suitable addiction resources

- Fentanyl and methamphetamine abuse leads to increased criminal offences across the board
- More than 90 fentanyl-related deaths in Calgary in 2015. More than 275 province wide
- Meth seizures jumped from 283 in 2014, to 467 in 2015



Fraud soars

- Fraud offences increased by 33% in 2015, compared to the previous year
- Number of fraud incidents reported to CPS jumped to 4,073 in 2015 – that's 1,000 additional cases from the year prior
- Fraud is underreported. Only an estimated 5% of fraud is reported to police

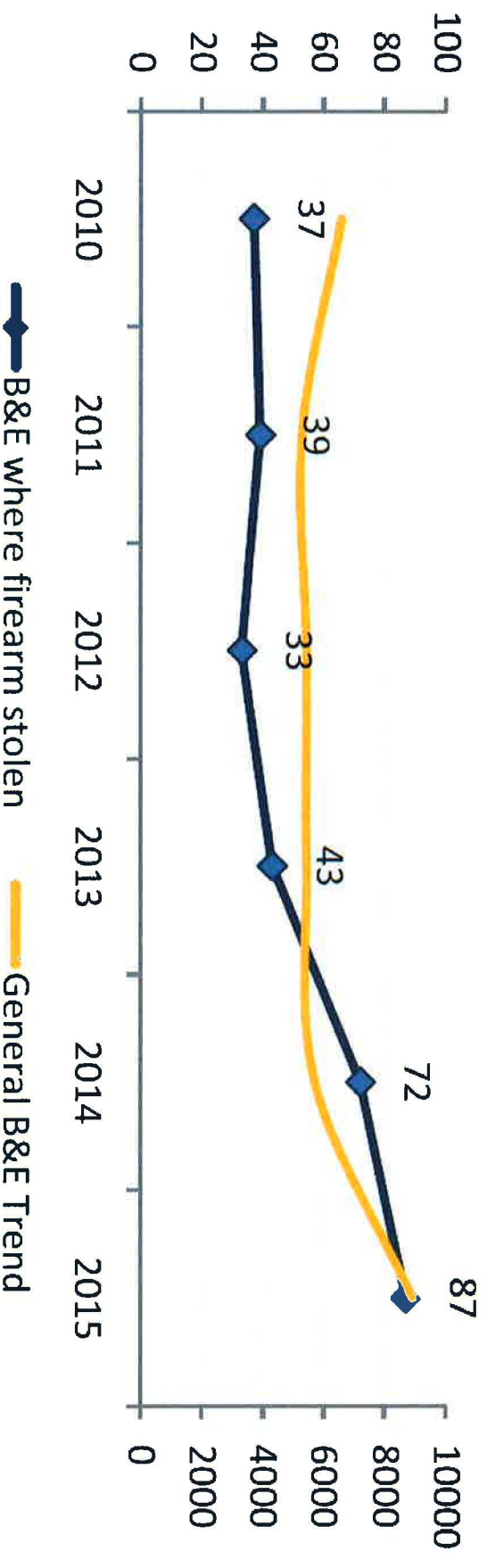

B&Es with Firearms Stolen compared to B&E Trend

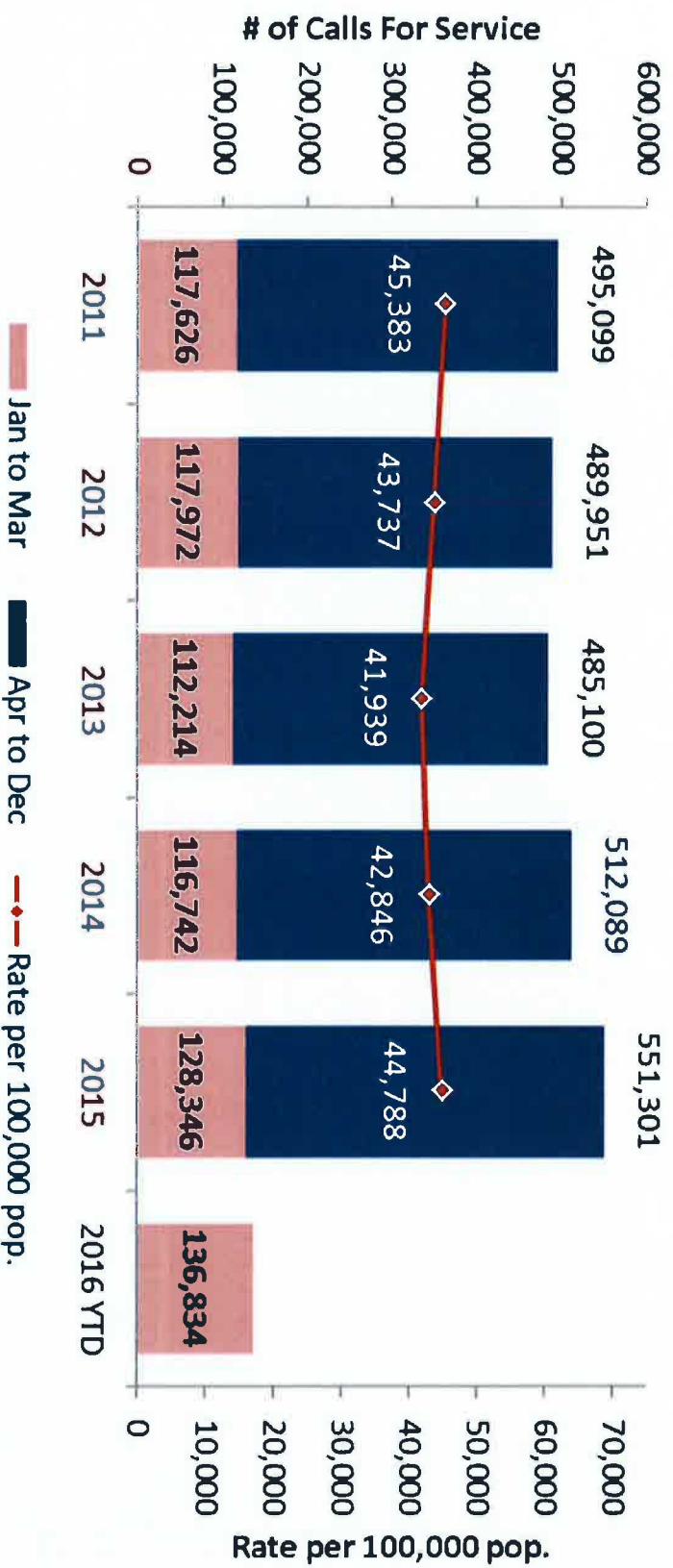

Total CFS - All Priorities

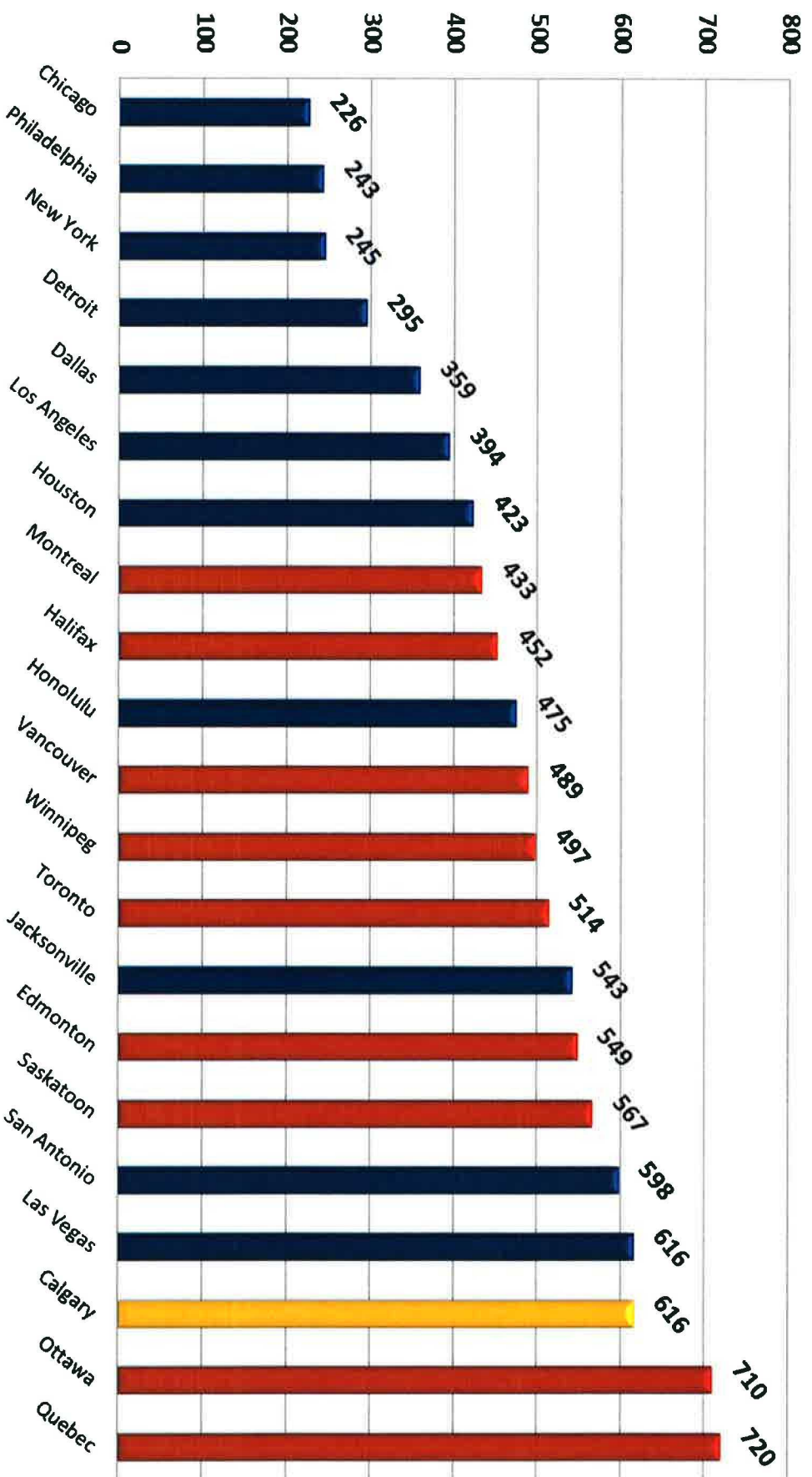


Patrol Support Team & CopLogic

- April 2016 Statistics
 - 1,204 CopLogic (online) reports filed
 - 288 witness/collision statements
 - 159 assisted in district calls
 - 318 completed district calls
 - 8 completed collision reports
 - 942 hours of follow-up
 - **3,112 total hours worked**



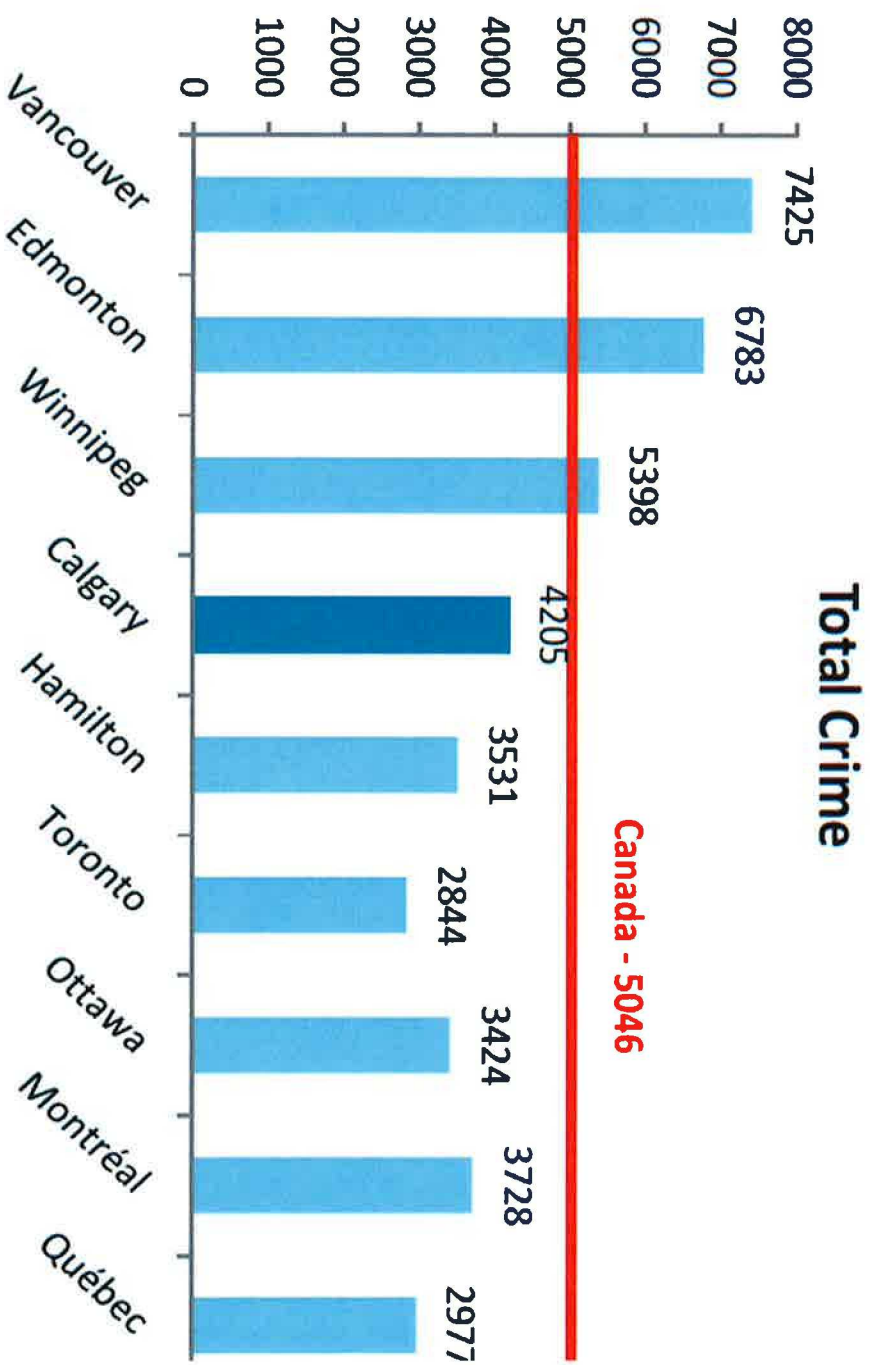
Population per Police Officer Major North American Cities

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School Resource Officers

- CPS provides 38 SROs to the CBE and CCSD – 17 high school, 8 junior high, 12 elementary, 1 ISSP
- These SROs specialize in early education lesson plans to develop resiliency and good decision making, moving to more complex issues at higher grades such as cyberbullying, gang interdiction, domestic and mental health issues, teen suicide and drug awareness
- Between now and 2018, the CBE & CCSD will add spaces for students through the addition of 31 new school facilities

CHALLENGES:

- While other jurisdictions (Edmonton) maintain a 1 officer per high school ratio, Calgary is scheduled to have 27 high schools and only 17 high school officers by 2018
- The gap grows at the level grades with 87 schools and 8 officers at junior high and an even greater ratio at elementary schools
- With the continued growth of charter, private and faith-based schools, Calgary now has 25,000 students in schools other than CBE and CCSD



Alarm Bylaw – Phased Approach

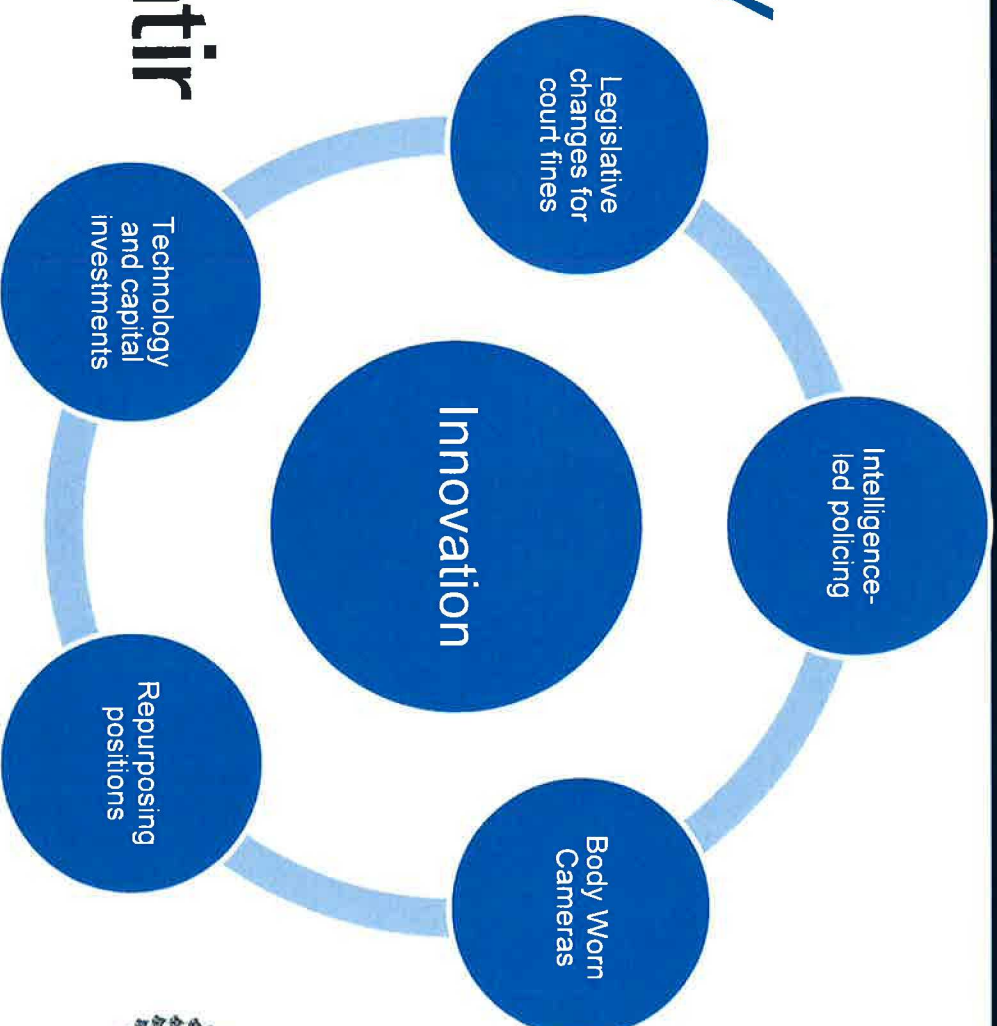
- Effective May 15, 2016 - Calgary 9-1-1 will no longer dispatch police to locations with '1-hit' alarm activations, where only one zone has been activated in a premise
- Alarm agencies will also be required to conduct enhanced call verification, where they must attempt to contact at least two key holders prior to contacting police
- A second phase will be brought in during the second half of 2016, where Calgary 9-1-1 will no longer dispatch police to premises where:
 - no valid alarm permit exists
 - the permit is suspended
 - the call is within 14 days of installation
 - the alarm agency is not properly licensed
- Police will also no longer be dispatched to commercial premises during regular business hours, as indicated on the registered alarm permit.
