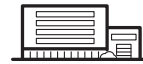

Mail-in ballots



Voters who are unable to vote during Advance Vote or on Election Day because of a disability, if you will be away, or if you are an election worker or scrutineer, you may apply to vote by special ballot through electionscalgary.ca

Elections Calgary's priority is to deliver an election that is safe and accessible to all eligible voters.

The stations have been carefully selected so that they are easy to access whether driving, walking, cycling or taking transit.



Most are located within a 2.5 km radius of residential areas (~10 minute drive) and have adequate free parking.



2/3 of advance vote stations are within 1 km of a high frequency stop (LRT/BRT/Max)



All stations are within 800 meters of regular service stops (~10 minute walk)

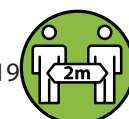
Accessibility



All voting stations have been inspected for accessibility. Accessibility considerations for community voting stations will be made available on electionscalgary.ca. On-site language translation will also be available at many locations.

Voter assist machines will be available at all Advance Voting stations for those with a disability.

Public safety



Voting at a designated station allows for COVID-19 precautions, including capacity limits, physical distancing and time for election workers to clean surfaces and ensure their own safety. It also ensures candidates and scrutineers can be accommodated in the voting stations, required by law. **We will be following all current public health regulations to make this a safe voting experience.**
