

- Calgarians want to make energy efficiency and renewable energy upgrades to their homes but face the **barrier of high upfront costs**.
- The Clean Energy Improvement Program (CEIP) reduces this barrier by providing flexible financing for clean energy improvements.
- To support economic recovery in response to COVID-19, the Economic Resilience Task Force recommended a low carbon financing program be launched in 2022.

Generate economic growth in the energy retrofits industry in Calgary and surrounding region




## Why CEIP?

- Federal funding available
- Creates foundation of low carbon financing programs in Calgary
