## Notes

‡The definition of 'strategy' that is applied here is adapted from Roger L. Martin's 2013 publication in the Harvard Business Review titled "Don't Let Strategy Become Planning."

"Strategy is an integrated set of choices to address five questions: (1.) what is our winning aspiration?; (2.) where will we play?; (3.) how will we win?; (4.) what capabilities need to be in place?; and (5.) what management systems must be instituted?" While some elements identified as strategy in this section do not explicitly indicate that they are strategies, they nevertheless address these five (5) questions.
