<ol> <li>Proximity Rules &amp; Sensitive Uses (Outcome: occupant safety, building protection)         The following elements will be included:         <ul> <li>Identify thresholds for risk assessments for residential within 30m; commercial uses may require a risk assessment</li> <li>Confirm approach to sensitive uses within 30m</li> <li>Increase the setback for habitable buildings in new development from 27.5m to 30.0m</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
<ul> <li>2) Area Based Emergency Response Access Strategy (Outcome: Occupant safety, building protection, emergency access)</li> <li>Develop a strategy to provide first responders with sufficient access, set up, and room to work along the railway corridor in the event of an emergency</li> <li>Railway corridor risk mapping - identify aggravating factors (slopes, curves, etc.); and mitigating factors (straight, flat sections, slow speeds, etc.)</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>3) Risk Assessments and Typical Mitigation Solutions (Outcome: Occupant safety, building protection)</li> <li>Identify when and where risk assessments will be required</li> <li>Determine acceptable risk mitigation measures</li> <li>Establish policy and/or guidelines for mitigating noise and vibration impacts</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>4) Council Risk Tolerance (Outcome: Occupant safety, building protection)</li> <li>Identify an acceptable level of risk</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>5) Advocacy (Outcome: Occupant safety, building protection, emergency access)</li> <li>Advocate to rail operators and other levels of government on issues of rail safety and rail operations</li> </ul>
