

	The City Clerk's Office reported back to Council on 2020 January 27 by:
	<ul> <li>a. providing an analysis of The City's current privacy practices;</li> <li>b. providing a Privacy Framework 2019-2021 Workplan;</li> <li>c. providing information on current City Bylaws, Policies, and Procedures;</li> <li>d. providing information on current City Access to Information and Privacy training;</li> <li>e. providing examples of Smart City initiatives;</li> <li>f. providing a privacy vision and principles for The City that reinforce and build upon the purposes set out in the FOIP Act;</li> <li>g. providing results from open source research regarding a comparison of various Chief Privacy Officer roles and responsibility models across the public, private and global sectors; and</li> <li>h. providing information on privacy risks and the privacy risks.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Council approved the following recommendations:</li> <li>a. the Privacy Framework 2019-2021 Workplan (Attachment 1); and</li> <li>b. direct the City Clerk/FOIP Head to provide an annual report to the Priorities and Finance Committee on The City's Privacy Management Program.</li> </ul>

	Council adopted Notice of Motion (C2019-0590), City of Calgary Citizen Privacy Data Practices, directing the Chief Security Officer/Chief Information Security Officer, the Chief Information Technology Officer, Chief Human Resource Officer and the City Clerk in consultation with appropriate City staff and leading external privacy experts to:
	<ul> <li>a. provide an analysis of The City's current privacy practices;</li> <li>b. develop a visible, accessible and overarching strategic Privacy Framework associated with digital infrastructure ('Smart Cities') and a Workplan for implementation;</li> <li>c. consider the Council Innovation Fund (CIF) which encourages innovation that has the potential to support or contribute to the goals of Council with city-wide application that have the</li> </ul>

- innovation that has the potential to support or contribute to the goals of Council with city-wide application that have the potential to change city-wide policies, practices and procedures; andd. consider conducting a city-wide public consultation process
