Dear Mayor Nenshi & Councillors.

On behalf of the Victoria Park Business Revitalization Zone, I would like to offer this letter as support of the first Administrative Recommendation number 1, PFC2016-0081 to approve a one-time increase to operating budget program #449 of \$7million from the Resiliency fund for Calgary Economic Development over a 3-year period.

The Calgary Economic Development *Opportunity Calgary* plan to attract, retain talent and accelerate diversification in our local economy will provide much needed support for both the business community and our citizens during this shift in the economic environment.

Attracting new office centres and more businesses is always welcomed throughout the city, and is especially critical in the Centre City. In addition, positioning Calgary as a global talent hub will enable our highly skilled workforce, particularly those who have been released from the energy sector, to continue to live, work and contribute to the vitality of our community.

While Calgary's economy has been slowly diversifying over the past decade, this current downturn only showcases how much further we have to go.
