Residential Traffic Safety Enforcement

## COUNCILLOR SHANE KEATING

**WHEREAS** Residential traffic safety represents a growing concern on the part of Calgary communities;

AND WHEREAS the Calgary Police Service (CPS) is committed to enhancing traffic safety through the reduction of collisions involving vehicles, pedestrians and cyclists;

AND WHEREAS while progress has been made to address traffic safety, with key CPS initiatives such as the Traffic Safety Request process, and the collaborative multi-agency Safer Mobility Team, a commitment to continual improvement is crucial;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that through a request to the Calgary Police Commission, that CPS consider the development of residential traffic enforcement options, in conjunction with its key City and community stakeholders, and that these options focus on:

- targeting high risk residential areas such as school and playground zones along with other pedestrian rich locations;
- utilizing citizen feedback through the Traffic Safety Request system to inform operational response;
- · emphasizing proactive public education to enhance public awareness; and
- sharing traffic enforcement data with City partners to support further intervention approaches when needed, including traffic calming measures.

**AND FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED** that through the Calgary Police Commission, CPS be requested to report back to the Standing Policy Committee on Community & Protective Services with associated options, recommendations and financial implications by no later than 2016 July.
