The total capital funding requirements for short-term actions (2016-18) is \$15,000,000. Anticipated capital funding requirements over those 3 years is \$4M in 2016, \$5.5M in 2017, and \$5.5M in 2017. This table shows a breakdown of a full year (e.g. \$5.5M) of funding requirements by focus area.

Currently identifiable funding is \$4M from the currently approved City-wide Active Modes Program (126-103). Transportation will continue to seek additional funding sources to fund the remaining capital requirements (\$11M).

The current Transportation Department annual capital budget is \$350-\$400 million. Through the Council approved 2015-18 Action Plan, approximately \$25 million (or 7%) of that budget focuses on pedestrian infrastructure. The Pedestrian Strategy requires roughly an additional \$6 million capital funding per year. As the chart below shows, this represents a 2% increase in the pedestrian-share of the Department's annual budget.
