

Summary of Responsibility Changes Deputy City Manager and General Managers

Deputy City Manager - Brad Stevens:

- 1. Lead Infrastructure Calgary, a new initiative to oversee and recommend to Council a corporate infrastructure investment program
- 2. Supply Management
- 3. Real estate services:
 - i. Real estate in Corporate Properties and Buildings (CPB) joins real estate and development services in Office of Land Servicing and Housing
 - i. CPB to focus on facility maintenance and assume responsibility for vertical project management for Community Services department building
- 4. Intergovernmental and Corporate Strategy:
 - i. Includes regional planning

General Manager, Planning & Development - Stuart Dalgleish:

- 1. Planning & Development:
 - i. Includes growth management
 - ii. Includes implementation of the Off-site Levy Bylaw work plan
- 2. Managing Director Joel Armitage:
 - i. Assumes responsibility for enhancing the quality, consistency and timeliness of decision making in the planning applications approval process
 - ii. Responsibility for making decisions between business units when there are differences of opinion about development permit and other applications or conditions associated with them

General Manager, Community Services - Kurt Hanson:

1. Affordable housing initiatives and policy from Office of Land Servicing and Housing to join Calgary Housing

Chief Financial Officer - Eric Sawyer:

1. Assessment

<u>General Manager, Urban Strategy – Rollin Stanley:</u>

- 1. Strategic assignment housed in City Manager's Office
- 2. Delivery of a comprehensive urban strategy:
 - i. Includes redevelopment potential of the Municipal Complex/Arts Commons/Olympic Plaza Civic District, West Village, and City-owned and other lands in the downtown core, inner city and urban corridors
 - ii. Includes redevelopment potential of lands along the Green Line
- 3. Increased focus on projects such as the Main Streets Initiative (urban corridors)
- 4. Continued service as The City's "Chief Planner" in advising Council at public hearings and on complex planning matters
