Heritage Significance

(from the *Inventory of Evaluated Historic Resources*)

Style Value

It is a unique statement of the Expressionist-style in Calgary.

Symbolic Value

It is a symbol of the Scout and Guide movements, and the 1967 National Centennial building program.



Riley Park

Ward 7 – 800 12 ST NW

Built – 1911

Heritage Status - First added to The City's Heritage Inventory in 2009

Heritage Significance

(from the *Inventory of Evaluated Historic Resources*)

People Value

Located on former Riley family lands, it is associated with Ezra Riley, a prominent figure in Calgary's early history who donated part of the land for the park.

Design Value

It is also associated with William Reader, Superintendent of Calgary Parks and Cemeteries 1913-1942, who designed and implemented much of Riley Park.



Senator Patrick Burns Memorial Rock Garden

Ward 7 – 1103 10 ST NW

Built - 1956

Heritage Status - First added to The City's Heritage Inventory in 2018



Heritage Significance

(from the *Inventory of Evaluated Historic Resources*)

People Value

It is associated with prominent Calgarians, Senator Patrick Burns, one of the 'Big Four' backers of the first Calgary Stampede, and Alex Munro, Superintendent of Calgary Parks 1949-1960s.

Design Value

It is valued for its unique design and status as one of the few rock gardens in Calgary.
