- Some Calgarians often avoid certain activities to reduce experience of street harassment

- Bylaw: London, ON and Edmonton, AB
- Multifaceted approach used internationally



Amendment to Public Behaviour Bylaw

Harass:

to "communicate with a person in a manner that could reasonably cause offence or humiliation, including conduct, comment, or actions that refers to the person's race, religious beliefs, colour, disability, age, ancestry, place of origin, marital status, source of income, family status, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, and includes a sexual solicitation or advance.

Penalty/Fine: \$500

Effective Date: June 1, 2022
