Recommendations

That the Infrastructure and Planning Committee recommends that Council:

- 1. Endorse in principle the RouteAhead 10-year update scope and direct Administration to proceed with updating RouteAhead and RouteAhead Project Prioritization with a programmatic approach, returning to Council no later than Q4 2022.
- 2. Advocate for permanent transit operating funding to the provincial and federal governments.
- 3. Direct Administration to continue advocacy with the Government of Alberta on a long-term funding extension for the Low Income Transit Pass program and to develop recommendations for a long-term sustainable funding model for the Low Income Transit Pass program.



RouteAhead Core Principles



CUSTOMER EXPERIENCE

- Make it easy to use.
- Safe, accessible, clean, convenient, comfortable and reliable.
- Address barriers to use for non-users.

NETWORK PLANNING

- Match transit to land use.
- Focus investment on increasing ridership.
- Evolve from a radial network to a connective grid.

FINANCING TRANSIT

- Meet near-term revenue/cost ratio (50/50).
- Meet capital funding objectives of Investing in Mobility.
- Take care of and optimize what we can control.





Customer Experience

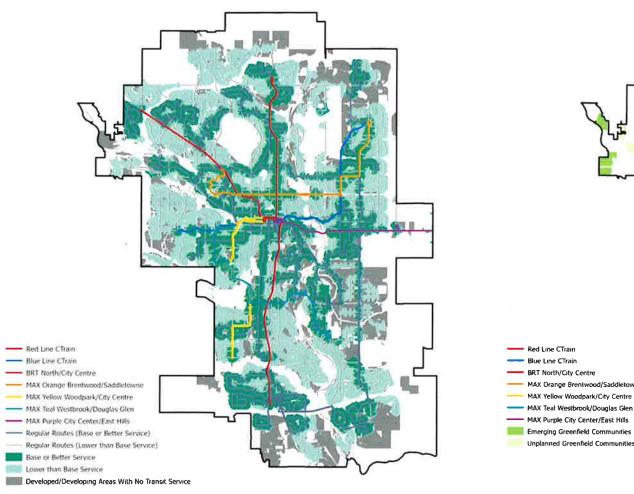
- While depressed in Q1-2021 Customer Satisfaction has rebounded in Q3-2021.
- Service impacts from cutbacks and adjustments are straining customer limits with overall trip times.
- Increased mobile application use has led to greater customer awareness of service disruptions and travel planning options.
- Increased use of My Fare and UPass integration.
- Perceptions of safety and security are in decline as a results of social unrest at CTrain stations and transit stops.
- Enhanced COVID-19 cleaning protocols and passenger mask adherence.

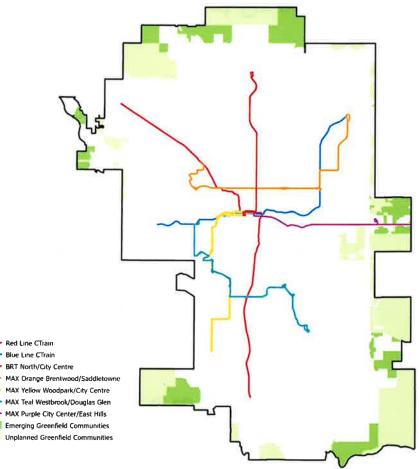

2021 Calgary Transit For New Communities







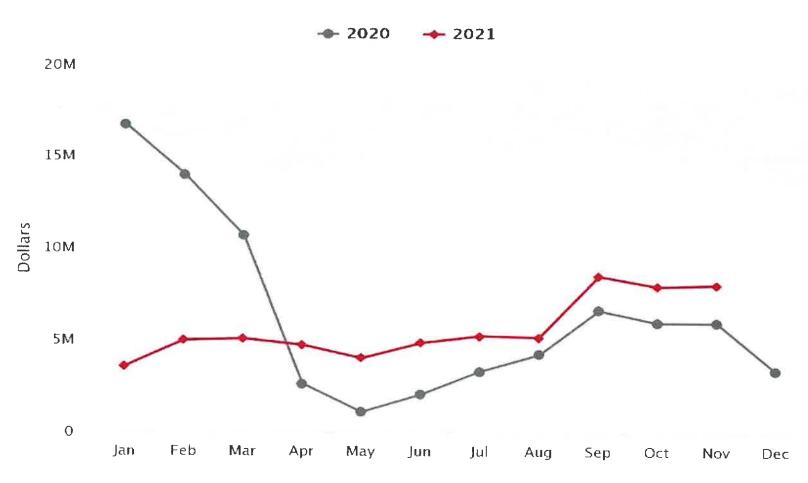
Network Planning Highlights

Calgary Transit Fare Revenue Comparison for 2020 and 2021





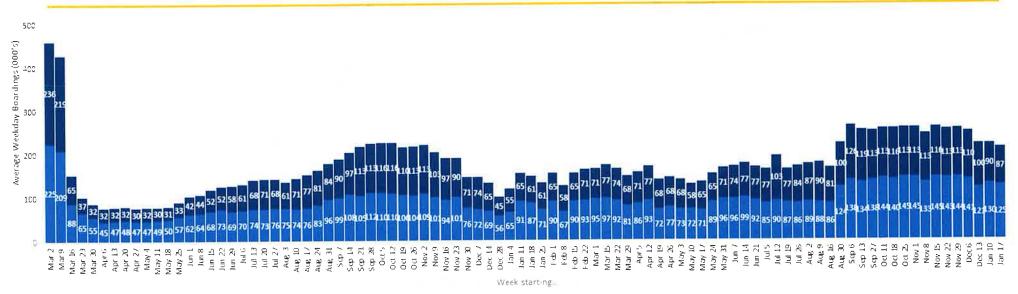

We are 39% of average annual pre-COVID ridership with 75% of pre-covid service





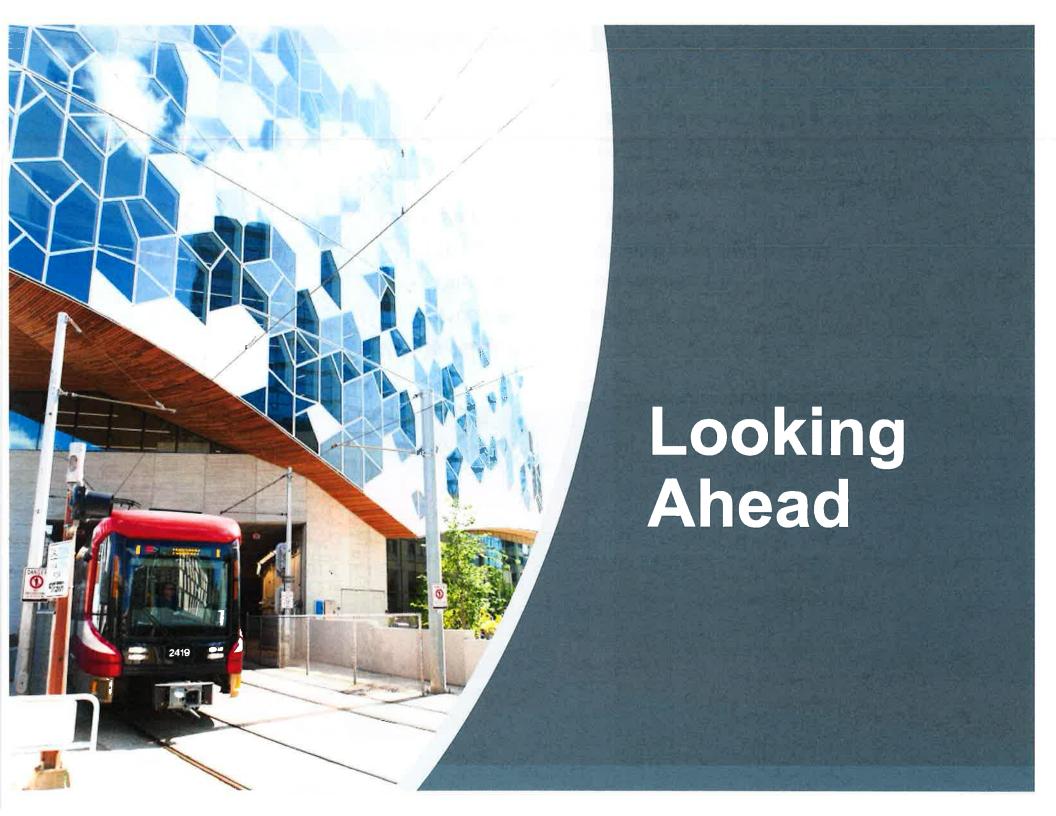
Financing Transit

2021 Revenue Shortfall

- \$106M Revenue Shortfall for 2021.
- Offset by \$82M in cost reductions.
- \$63-89M Revenue Shortfall anticipated for 2022.

Low Income Transit Pass Funding

- Provincial funding of \$4.5M per year ends in March 2023.
- 40,000 applicants and 233,000 monthly passes sold in 2021.
- One-time funding of \$4M in 2018 and \$6M in 2019 to manage gaps.
