To adopt a Deputy Mayor Roster for 2016 January to December.

PREVIOUS COUNCIL DIRECTION / POLICY

Section 152 of the *Municipal Government Act* states in part, that:

- “152(1) A council must appoint one or more councillors as deputy chief elected official so that
- (a) only one councillor will hold that office at any one time, and
 - (b) the office will be filled at all times.
- (2) A deputy chief elected official must act as the chief elected official
- (a) when the chief elected official is unable to perform the duties of the chief elected official, or
 - (b) if the office of chief elected official is vacant.”

Sections 6 and 7 of the Procedure Bylaw 44M2006, as amended, states that Council, at its Organizational Meeting, shall adopt a roster of Deputy Mayors for the following year. In the absence, incapacity or inability of the Mayor or Deputy Mayor to act, the next Deputy Mayor, (in the rotation approved in the roster), shall assume the Chair as Acting Mayor.

BACKGROUND

Each year, City Council is required to ensure coverage of the duties of the Mayor accomplished through the adoption of the Deputy Mayor Roster.

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The Deputy Mayor's role is also to represent The City of Calgary on behalf of the Mayor at civic functions in cases where the Mayor has declined. Examples of such events include ribbon cuttings, proclamations and addressing meetings of various interest groups.

INVESTIGATION: ALTERNATIVES AND ANALYSIS

Councillors Pootmans and Woolley did not serve as Deputy Mayor during 2015 and it is recommended that they serve as Deputy Mayor for the months of 2015 January and February, respectively.

A random drawing of the remainder of the Councillor names was conducted for the months of 2016 March to December and the City Clerk recommendation reflects the order of names drawn.
