2021 Borrowing Bylaw Repeals

RECOMMENDATION:

Give first reading to Bylaw 10B2021, being a bylaw authorizing a reduction of \$44.4 million in authorized borrowing.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Annually a review of all existing borrowing bylaws is completed to assess if the borrowing capacity is required.
- For 2021, borrowing bylaws 10B2014 (\$18.6 million) and 13B2014 (\$25.8 million) issued by Utilities and Environmental Protection Services in 2014 could be repealed as other funding sources were found.
- Strategic Alignment to Council's Citizen Priorities: A well-run city

DISCUSSION

- The \$44.4 million is requested to be repealed as borrowing capacity in bylaw 15B2011, a bylaw for financing water upgrades and improvements, combined with capacity in the offsite levy reserve provided sufficient funding.
- Borrowing bylaws 10B2014 and 13B2014 were never borrowed upon.
